#### 内容提要

《大学英语四级考试大纲》对学生在词汇和语法方面均有一定的要求。大学英语四级的"Vocabulary and Structure(词汇与结构)"这一部分就是考查学生对词语用法和语法结构的掌握程度的。

本书是严格按照教育部最新颁布的《大学英语教学大纲》而编写的。

本书共选人 2 500 题,内容丰富,涉及面广。在词汇和语法方面,本书覆盖了四级考试的考生应掌握的全部重点和难点,有较强的实效性和典型性。本书是备考大学英语四级考试的最佳选择书。

#### 前言

为了全面帮助高等院校学生进行大学英语四级考试的复习。 我们组织具有大学英语教学和应试经验的教师编写了《大学英语 自测与提高(词汇与结构)》。本书严格按照教育部最新颁布的 《大学英语教学大纲》编写。

《大学英语四级考试大纲》要求学生必须"领会式掌握 4 200 条单词(其中复用式掌握的单词为 2 500 条)以及由这些词构成的常用词组 1 600 条,并且有按照基本构词法识别生词的能力"。在语法方面,要求学生"巩固和加深基本语法知识,提高在语篇水平上运用语法知识的能力"。大学英语四级考试的"Vocabulary and Structure (词汇与结构)"这一部分就是考查学生对词语用法和语法结构的掌握程度的。

词汇与语法结构是英语学习的基础。学生对词汇与语法结构 掌握得好坏,直接影响其听说读写能力,没有一定的词汇和语法结构知识,要想真正提高英语水平是不可能的。因此,学生必须重视词汇与语法结构的学习与训练。

学习词汇与语法结构不是简单地背诵词汇和语法规则,而是要大量做题,在具体的语境中熟练掌握,做到融会贯通、得心应手,从而提高英语语言的实际运用能力。

本书共选人 2 500 道题,内容丰富,几乎覆盖了四级考生应掌握的全部重点、难点词汇和语法,具有较强的实效性和典型性。是参加四级考试的学生的最佳选择书。
