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内容简介

《大学英语四、六级疑难题集解》由笔者集国内各家教材之精华,博采各类习题解法之长编选而成。全书内容共分三部分,第一部分为笔者从多年教学积累而成的资料中选出的1200 道习题,每题共有四个选项以供选择。题量丰富,题型多变而全面,并具有一定的典型性。第二部分为习题答案。第三部分为习题解法注释。通过类比,同义、近义词比较,疑难句翻译等途径,画龙点睛般地突出了每道题的语言难点。阅后能使读者融会贯通,系统地巩固已学的语法知识,掌握各种语言现象,加深对这些内容的理解,是参加四、六级考试的考生理想的考试复习指导材料。

前 言

在大学英语四、六级考试中,经常会出现一些疑难试题。为了帮助广大同学更好地学好英语,攻克这些难点,笔者根据多年的教学经验,并在研究了几年来四、六级试题的基础上,对所出现过的难点进行归纳、分类,编成了这本《大学英语四、六级疑难题集解》。

本书对绝大部分题目都做了注解,难题附有译文,每道 试题均有答案,对有些词组及习惯用法还提供了一些相关 知识,便于读者使用。

本书吸取了目前大学英语教学中各种通用教材之精 华,并与《大纲》紧密联系,由易渐难,逐步深入,难易结合, 深入浅出地分析了四、六级英语考试中常见的疑难题型及 解答方法,适用于四、六级考生以及参加硕士研究生入学考 试的读者,是一本难得的参考书。笔者希望本书能够对读者 在巩固英语基础知识,提高英语基本技能,增强对四、六级 英语的应试能力等方面有所裨益。
