在《大学英语趣味听力》付梓问世之际,我十分高兴为我的同事们编写的这本大 学英语听力辅助教材写一篇简短的序文。

长期以来,我园的非专业英语教学,一直囿于"培养学生藉助字典阅读本专业文献"的框框之内,听与说则视为无法超越和不得超越的"禁区"。80年代后,改革开放的思想观念强有力地推动了非专业英语数学工作的开展,全国统编了高标准的教材,统一进行测试,普通采用用英语授课,听力课正式列入课程,音像资料也进入课堂教学,非专业英语数学工作出现了前所未有的生动活泼、开拓向上的局面,大有赶超专业英语教学的趋势。在听说课教学方面,可以说实现了零的突破。《大学英语趣味听力》的编写与出版,在我们内蒙古的自治区的非专业英语教学史上,无疑就是一个这方面的尝试。

教材的编者之一云麟老师,毕业于北京外国语学院,在英语听说能力方面接受过严格的训练,毕业后一直担任专业英语的听说课教学工作,积累了丰富的教学经验和素材。另一位编者董金梅老师,毕业于北京师范大学,在外语教学理论方向有深厚的功底,毕业后长期从事非专业英语的工作,熟读大学英语教学的特点、规律、现状和发展超向。由她们二位共同编写的这本大学英语听力课辅助教材,就指导原则和可操作性来讲,是一次成功的合作。

《趣味听力》这部教材分为三个水平,在词汇、语法和语篇方面,由浅入深,由短及长,基本句型和生核词汇的重复率极高,具趣味性、可读性和可听性贯穿全书始末。这本教材,不仅适用于正在学习《大学英语》课程的文理科大学生,也适用于英语专业低年级学生和对英语特点感兴趣的高中生。就是对于按照旧"套数"培养出来的只具有阅读能力的上了年岁的读者,如果"重心不泯",仍有愿望培养自己的听说能力,这本教材也是适用的,因为他们从"书写形式"上已经掌握了这些词汇,好象出国时兑换外币一样,只要把"书面形式"变换成"语音形式",就可以定全听懂。而且随着语言的"声流"不断泻入大脑,在感受英语的味和提高对书卷语中英语小调所表现的细报差别的理解也是相得益彰的,从而达到供他们已经掌握的书面语得以升华。

语言本身并不是一门科学,而是一整套一整套习惯的总汇。学习外语最忌讳"三天打鱼,两天晒网",正确的学习方法应当是"天天打鱼,永不晒网,英语不绝于耳"。日久天长,习惯也就养成了。其次,要培养和提高自己的听说能力,还有一个转变观念的问题。我认识不少事非语言专业的朋友和同事,他们的书面英语水平都很不错,如果

把他们已经掌握的书面英语变成他们可接受的"语音形式",他们是完全可以讲英语和听懂别人讲英语的。问题的关键是他们自己把听说视为"禁忍",不敢越雷地一步。其实只要豁出来,红上几次脸,不要口羞,就会慢慢学会讲英语并听懂别人讲的英语。所谓使用英语交际,跟打乒乓球一样,整个变际过程实际上就是"乒"和"乓"的接球和发球过程的无限延续。当然,口语交际的文化档次最终还是以书面语言为依托的。

英语中有一句谚语:"The proof of the pudding is in the eating."云麟老师和董金梅老师为我们奉献了一份 pudding,可口与否,希望大家潮来品尝。

积愿这本辅助教材的使用者,在领略英语这发达语言的风采的过程中,获得全新的感受。

#### 前言

近年来,我们高兴地看到:听力课虽然在公共外语教学中设置的时间不长,但已 经走上正规。特别是公共英语统编教材《大学英语听力》给公共英语学生提供了比较 系统的听能训练材料,经使用证明是一套英语听力训练的好教材。

欣喜之余,我们注意到了另一个方面:对于好多学生来说,仅仅是听力课上的内容已经满足不了他们的需要了。经常有些学生来找我们,希望给他们推荐一些课堂教材以外的听力材料。我们在教学中也感到:公外学生英语听力的提高光靠设置的听力课是不够的,应该补充一些内容与程度合适的泛听材料,以便达到更好的学习效果。基于这些考虑,我们根据目前学生入学时的英语水平以及大学英语分级教学要求,按照循序渐进的原则,选编了这套《大学英语趣味听力》,作为《大学英语听力》教程的辅助教材,供公外学生和其他英语学习者使用。

兴趣是学习的动力,我们在听力教学中也深深体会到了这一点。为了帮助学生逐步培养听英语的兴趣,我们在选编过程中把材料的趣味性放在了首位。这样,除了课堂上紧张的专项听能训练外,学生们还可以轻松地听这些趣味故事,从中得到乐趣,在不知不觉中提高听英语的兴趣。

《大学英语趣味听力》分三部分。第一部分为一百个趣味小段。每篇一百个单词左右,词汇量控制在一千个单词之内。这些小段既可以作为听能训练材料,也可以作为口语训练的复述材料使用,第二部分有一百四十个趣味故事,大部分故事后都配有问题,以便学生听后检查自己的听力理解。每篇故事大约二百至四百个单词,词汇量控制在二千个单词以内。第三部分是三十三篇童话名著和趣味故事。随着学生们听力的提高,他们可以把这些材料作为听力欣赏,同时通过听这些篇幅较长的材料培养对较长材料语篇的整体听力理解能力。这部分材料的词汇量要比前两部分的大,涉及的语法也比一、二部分的稍难,因此大部分材料都配有注释。

《大学英语趣味听力》分上、下两册出版。上册包括一、二部分;第三部分为下册。两册均配有录音磁带。

本教材第一部分由云麟整理选编。第二部分由董金梅整理选编。第三部分由董金梅、云麟二人共同选编。

录音配乐、剪辑、合成由外语系电教室康连娣完成,技术指导电教室主任张玉珉。 美籍教师 Debbie Chinn 承担了部分录音工作。

在此我们向以上人士致以谢意。

由于时间仓促,特别是其中有些材料是根据录音记录、整理而成,缺点、错误之处,在所难免。欢迎广大学生和其他英语爱好者在使用本教材后提出宝贵意见。
