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总前言

随着国内外形势的发展,如中国加入世界贸易组织、北京申奥成功等,掌握外语已成为人们的迫切需要。

听力是学习与掌握外语的重要技能之一,也是中国人学习外语的弱点与难点,有必要进行专门的训练。

此系列教材适用对象是具有**初级**及**略高于初级**英语水平的人群。它能帮助参加高考的考生应试英语,也有助于参加国内外各种英语考试如 IELTS、PETS 的人打好听力基础,同时更适于作为基础英语听力训练的课堂教材及自学教材。

编者认为提高听力与掌握一定的词汇量、基本的语法、句型和一定的背景知识密切相关。同时听力技能的提高不是孤立的,它与整个语言水平、综合能力的提高密不可分。此系列教材是以此为出发点并结合中国人学习英语的实际情况编写的,因此具有以下特点:

1. 内容上以基本词汇与语法为主,技能训练上以听力为主。

本系列教材的练习册部分分为"词汇篇"和"语法篇"。"词汇篇"每课的第1部分出现某一题材的词汇,如亲属、职业、食物、数字、方位、服装、建筑、交通、山脉、江河、国家、城市、运动、动物、植物、天气、旅游等。"语法篇"每课的第1部分出现某一语法内容。语法包括了基本词法、句法及常见的语言点。

2. 内容相对集中。

学生围绕某一重点学习效果较好。书中的词汇以专题集中出现,各语法及语言点也——分别集中出现。

3. 注意内容的重复与滚动。

为避免语言现象集中出现而学新忘旧,特别注意了内容的复现与滚动,为此安排了复习和总复习。

4. 练习形式多样,有针对性。

本书有几十种不同的练习,生动活泼,有效地训练学生的听及读写说的能力。尤其编写了针对中国学生弱点的练习,如帮助学生克服注意听时顾不上读与写,听懂了内容却记不住信息等困难;再如编入了他们的典型错误使其明辨正误。

5. 教材的内容安排科学。

"词汇篇"和"语法篇"每册各 25 个单元,每 6 个单元为一组,每组的第 6 个单元是该组的复习。"词汇篇"的第 25 单元是该册的阶段复习,"语法篇"的第 25 单元是全套教材的总复习。

此系列教材包括"词汇篇"和"语法篇"两本练习册及它们各自的学习参考书,共计4册, "词汇篇"和"语法篇"另外各配录音带一套。练习册是练习用书,学习参考书中有全部听力原 文及答案,并在相应部分标出重点,便于自学。由于本系列教材包括了各方面的基本词汇和基 础语法,内容丰富,题材多样,不失为一本综合教材,听力训练后可利用学习参考书全面复习以 提高综合能力。本教材中有各种考试中常见的形式,对于要参加各种考试的考生会大有帮助。

本书已在北京语言文化大学出国人员培训部试用几年,效果良好。但缺点错误在所难免,望多批评指正。
