

#### 前 言

本练习册系根据1984年《大学英语教学大纲》(高等学校理工科学生)选编的。全书共有12个测试练习,每个练习各包含100题,均以选择填空的形式出现,便于学生对比后答题。本书以词汇练习为主,占85%,所选词汇以大纲中1-4级为基础,伴有少数5-6级的词汇。编选时,考虑到了由浅入深的原则:即从最常用的词汇搭配到较少使用的动词词组。语法以大纲中语法结构表为依据,选取学生容易混淆的结构。全部例句精选自原版词典、书籍以及近年来国外测试题和国内非英语专业研究生入学试卷。书末附有答案。本书十分适合大学本科生英语学习过关测试及报考硕士研究生复习之用。
