

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内容提要

本书为配合《大学英语精读》(该书目前在我国高校中使用最为广泛)教学编写而成,旨在帮助学生复习、巩固课堂所学的内容,并在检测自己学习成果的同时,为各类标准考试作准备。

本书共有八套试题,包括听力、词汇、语法结构、完形填空、阅读理解及翻译等内容。书末附有参考答案、难点、要点解释以及听音材料文字稿。资料部分取自英美原版书刊、全部提问及解答、注释均系自编,与课文相互呼应,其难度基本与《大学英语教学大纲》的同级要求相当,具有新颖、规范,精简明了之特点,全书曾由外籍教师及国内有关知名教授审阅。

编者的话

分别由翟象俊、李荫华等主编、上海外语教育出版社出版的《大学英语》是目前我国高校中使用最为广泛的一套英语教材。许多学生学完了这套教材之后,都想检验一下自己的学习成绩。我们这套《新编〈大学英语〉测试(1—4级)》就是为了满足广大同学的这一需要而编写的。

测试不能代替教学,但若应用得法,则可以促进教学。在本套书的编写过程中,我们将《大学英语》的要点及难点都分门别类地融入了各份试卷。我们希望同学们能在课堂学习之余,抽空做些试题,一则检测自己的英语水平,二则可以借此复习所学课本的内容。为了便于自学,我们还特地编写了试题注释,希望能对同学们有所帮助。

本书各册的内容大致分为四个部分:一、试题;二、听力测试录音文字稿(录音磁带另外配套供应);三、答案;四、注释。各册试题难度基本与《大学英语教学大纲》的同级要求相当。

本书由翟象俊教授主审。除主编外,本册的编者还有:余建中、唐荣杰、汪洪章、尹小娅、 王美娣、吴建衡、张丽珍、孙晴霞等同志。另外,姜新荣、陈进、徐德明、吴光明、孙健、邱匡林、 景志剑等同志也参加了部分编写和其他具体工作。
