計順菲華中學建校至今，已歷五十個寒暑了，這五十年的滄桑巨變，連遭兩次祝融，兩次徹底破壞，無數次的再建設，形成今日兩棟巍峨校舍，多少學子曾經在這兒藏修憩遊，長大成材。計順菲華永遠跟隨著時代的巨輪轉變，“與時俱進”是它日益成長茁壯的不二法門。

面對快速變動的未來，“人才培育”是國家競爭力提升的重要關鍵。眼下世界各國不僅聚焦高等教育，以培育出活躍於世界舞台的人才，更從創新基礎教育扎根做起，並持續尋找新的學習方法，運用新的學習器具，以更創新，更多元的方式，打造未來的新人才。

計順市菲華中學面對這樣的世界潮流，務須與時俱進，明確制度方針，依循管理教學現代化的原則，尤其在政府施行 K-12 教育方案後，依著學生的資質去革新教學，去發掘天賦，激發潛能，塑造能力，實踐“適性揚才”、“多元發展”的教育政策，以迎合教育時尚的普世趨勢，是刻不容緩的。在實踐過程中，本校對於技職如何分類，教學與管理如何相輔相成，如何相得益彰，更應坦然接受考驗，用心找出一條可以邁向康莊大道的明路，事實上，這也是當前中等教育必須面對的挑戰。

另一項挑戰來自教育科技的推進與教學軟硬件設施之充實。美國科技教育學會 (International Technology Education Association, ITEA) 認為“科技”是人類創新的具體表現，並將“教育科技”詮釋為“利用多媒體科技或視聽器具等工具來促進教與學的歷程”。

面向雲端時代的來臨，計順菲華的脫胎換骨與蛻變已是勢在必行，因此，為了促進教學過程的成效，為了使教學的效能得以發揮極致，本校在教學上將以教務處為核心，以教研組為主線，根據學科予以分類，並以教研組長為主要負責人，俾能保持教與學過程中的科技運用，使之具有明顯的功能導向，並使科技的學習能著重在如何讓教學更具成效。當然科技與傳統教學的混合運用 (Blended Learning)，也是非常可取的作法，重點是有效教學。

體認到“以不變應萬變”並非可行之策，為了永續經營，為了繼五十年校慶後，再創輝煌，每個菲華人都應積極進取，認清時勢的轉化與潮流的導向，乘著 e 化教學的快車，趁著萬馬奔騰的勢頭，飛躍前進，才能完成百年樹人大計。

簡史

“萬丈高樓平地起”，計順菲華雖非樓高萬丈，然而，通過半個世紀的洗煉和積澱，今日在椰風蕉雨的千島之國她已是巍巍巋宇！

回溯既往，筚路藍縷。一九四九年，計順市熱心僑商有感於組織在地商會的必要性，因而興起組織計順市菲華商會之動機，以凝聚眾人力量，發揮團結精神，為更多華人造福。後經陳潢雄、丁文哲、王芳庭、洪揚華等人四出奔走呼籲，會員日益增多，俾使商會雛形粗具。

商會成立初期，雖說創業維艱，然諸負責人均能共體時艱，同心協力，終致組織完竣，會務緩緩步上軌道。迨第六、七屆理事長蔡孝固任內，在計順菲華現址購置土地，為肇建計順市菲華商會及學校永世基業立下先機。蔡德涎先生接任商會理事長後，興建商會辦公室，舉辦稅務講座以配合政府政策，代辦華人華裔常年報到手續，調解商務糾紛，迄鄭龍溪先生接任，商會諸事底定，理事會進而策劃申辦學校，迨蔡維露先生接掌理事會，幾經奔波遊說，最終以一萬元代價向“中國學校”購得執照，並獲教育局批准更名為“計順市菲華學校”，我校於焉正式開辦，成就蔡維露先生以中國優良傳統文化培育華裔子弟之夙願，時值一九六四年。

建校伊始，雖然只辦小學，然生數已逾百名，並延聘陳樹宗先生為首任校長，開辦英漢文雙語教學，以一棟二層木造房舍為教室，和商會辦公室毗鄰而居，雖因陋就簡，但從此書聲琅琅，弦歌不輟；我校草創初期，經陳華炎、謝文明、楊菁影幾任校長，至一九六八年方稚旭接任校長後，人事穩定，師資團隊堅強，加上董事長李天階、董事李鴻基等人熱心支助人力物力，舉凡各項體育、文娛活動均借用天階先生廠房進行練習，促使校務得以順利進行；蔡文圈先生更獨資設立幼稚園，之後又續辦中學，形成完整學制之規模。

當一切水到渠成，正欲展翅高飛之時，一九七一年開學前夕，我校不幸慘遭回祿，心血結晶盡付焦土。董事長李天階及諸理董事克盡厥職，從零再開始，以重建校舍為首要任務。重建期間雖說千頭萬緒，終能撥雲見日，以無比毅力排除萬難，東山再起，並致生數日漸增添。眼看一切漸入佳境，眾人正額手稱慶時，奈何天有不測風雲，一九七六年十月間，會所及校舍又不幸遭鄰火波及，所有文檔，包括歷屆理董事名錄、畢業生名冊、師生生活動照片全部付之一炬，蕩然無存。祝融肆虐，徒呼負負，近千名學生四顧茫然，學校陷入空前危機。其時，蔡敦錫理事長義不容辭，運籌帷幄，又得王孝瓊、蔡永亮、鄭榮福等人之勉勵與贊助，先後租得學校鄰近之 Williams Building Christian Church 及 Our Lady of Loreto 為臨時校舍，安頓學生，使弦誦不致斷絕；為求長遠之計，理事會旋即組織建築委員會，由蔡維露先生擔任建築主任，蔡世強、蔡永亮、邱小影為副，發動全體理董事、會員及各界熱心人士慷慨解囊，楊冬青理事並毅然承包工程，在還沒籌足建築費時就毅然破土動工；藉由眾人的通力合作，短短

六個月內，一座四層鋼筋水泥堂皇巒舍，便從滿目瘡痍，一片廢墟中拔地而起，凸顯菲華人越挫越勇的奮進精神。

嗣後三位功臣：王孝瓊、蔡永亮、鄭榮福在眾望所歸之下，擔任第十一、十二、十三、十四、十五屆董事長，生數增至千名，惟方稚旭校長因健康理由求去，由王孝瓊理事長兼掌校長之職。隨後聘請鄭亞森、施竹薇、謝順理、蔡天賜幾位教育家執掌校務，後因其他因素，由劉與淵董事代理校長，對教育局負責，後聘得學養俱佳的王蘊輝女士擔任校長，呈現另一中興局面。至第廿六屆理事長蔡世強接任，以其過人之膽識，深遠之目光，認為非增購地皮，無以謀擴充發展，適逢隔鄰地皮意欲出售，遂與學校創辦人蔡維露及蔡永亮、蔡敦錫、鄭榮福、劉與淵、侯世炳等諸理董事作將伯之呼，甚或舉行籌款晚會，得社會碩彥紛解義囊，復蒙工商巨擘陳永栽先生振臂一呼，以身作則，慨捐巨款，楊冬青理事立即響應，應允承建工程，並獲諸多熱心辦學人士支持，駝負千鈞，蟻背一粟，踵事增華，另一座五層鋼筋水泥校舍巍然矗立於幅員遼闊的計順市。

自第卅二屆理事長劉與淵，第十九屆董事長許清彩就任以來，校務已上軌道，組織更形健全，陣容益發鼎盛。校董之熱忱，同仁之忠盡，上下合作無間，使學校令譽蒸蒸日上。為著更上層樓，於一九九〇年劉與淵先生擔任董事長時，組成華文教學觀摩團，由蔡維露、劉與淵、楊媽愿、丁德仁等諸董事率領，回到中華文化搖籃地取經，遍歷北京、南京、上海、寧波、杭州、桂林、香港觀摩訪問，汲取他人辦校經驗，使教師在教學領域內，更能得心應手，此為華校之創舉，益見校董之智慧與熱誠。並於三十週年校慶時，籌募教職員福利基金，大幅度提升教職員福利。

蔡理事長清潔一直強調要“提升學校層次”，並得指導員邱秀敏女士多方協助，在歷任理事長施純昌、蔡清潔、蔡聰妙、蔡天心、施文界，董事長楊媽愿、鄭黃秀容、黃呈輝、林玉燕諸賢者領導下，配合常務顧問群策群力，勵精圖治，不僅大舉整建禮堂、視聽室、圖書館等校舍，並使之全面冷氣化，另添置教學器材，增闢電腦室和遊樂場以外，更促成校友會的復會；蔡聰妙理事長並為學校設置建築基金、電腦發展基金以及教職員退休公積金；四十週年校慶時，理董事們更是熱烈捐獻，除了進一步整修幼兒園、學生廁所、校長室、教職員辦公室之外，更廣設教育補助基金，為學校之永續發展，殫精竭慮。時值林玉燕董事長兼任校長之際。林校長卸任後，乃聘請李淑慧女士

接掌校長之職，另聘陳惠玲女士副之。

當計順菲華跨步邁向金禧五十週年時，接任的理事長黃金盾、施偉廉、張昭和、許能公、葉芳楓、許煥燃，董事長劉龍泉、蔡景明、蔡榮衛、蔡美倫、侯斌鴻、劉勤諸賢者承接重任，接續前任未完工作，於內，則加碼學生助學基金，全面進行教學改革、重視英文部教學，裝設電梯乙座、增募建築費以加蓋前面小樓、增建化學實驗室、幼兒園辦公室、遊樂場，並大幅度地更新衛生設施，於外則加深且增廣對外交流，再次振起前人披荊斬棘的創業精神，為締建計順菲華的世紀偉業而竭盡所能地鋪陳康莊大道。

本校何幸有一位具高瞻遠矚的指導員陳永栽博士時賜南針，加上關心教育的諸位理董事，殷殷垂注，尤其難能可貴的是，能克紹箕裘的第二代，如蔡維露、蔡廷邦、劉與淵、蔡清潔、施純昌理事長的後繼者蔡美倫、蔡景明、劉勤、蔡榮衛、施偉廉等人士，幼承庭訓，充分理解先人辦學之苦心孤詣，承先啟後，繼往開來，願意秉承先人遺志，熱心教育是為本校能繼承傳統，跟上時代步伐之原動力。校友們即使尚未能盡情揮灑，也願竭盡力量為扶持學弟學妹為母校之蓬勃發展而努力付出。五十周年校慶，校友們發揮了愛校護校的拳拳心意，舉辦一次規模龐大，匯聚全體校友的返校活動，可為明證。

五十年來，計順菲華幸承歷屆領導人的辛苦耕耘、無私付出與務實領航，加以全體教職員均能遵循學校“從嚴治校，從嚴治教，從嚴治學”的一貫政策，全心追隨現任校長李淑慧女士所引領“翻轉教育”、“與時俱進”的大方向，克盡厥職，積極參與海內外各項進修活動，自我提升，讓計順菲華享譽海內外，更齊心協力以e化教學引導計順菲華朝“菲華文化藝術教學中心”和“優秀科技學校”的教育目標大步邁進。

計順菲華在歷史的滾滾長河中，拔身而起，縱使兩度遭受回祿之殃，校舍與文檔資料等軟硬件設施一併化為灰燼，卻依然不畏艱難險阻，勇往直前，固守百年樹人的薪傳事業，負起延續中華文化、作育英才的重責大任，於今，其蓬勃發展的勢頭，實可謂方興未艾。

五十年的歲月，雖有滄桑，但更多的是，帶給學子豐碩學習成果的喜悅，以及目睹校友在各個領域出類拔萃的那一份份驕傲與滿足；悠悠五十年，歲月流轉無情，雖說桃花依舊在，人事卻隨著時光的巨輪更迭頻仍，再者，商校兩會，歷年任要職人士眾多，一時不及備載，倘有遺珠之憾，或是未盡翔實、訛誤之處，尚祈不吝斧正。

Fifty Years of the Philippine Institute of Quezon City - A Brief History

The Philippine Institute of Quezon City (PIQC) was founded in 1964, but to tell the story of how it started, we have to go back fifteen years. In 1949, Chinese businessmen of Quezon City decided to come together for the cause of strengthening local business community and preserving Chinese culture overseas. It was with relentless efforts of Mr. Tan Eng Hiong, Mr. Ting Bun Kiat, Mr. Ong Hong Ting, Mr. Ang Yong Hua that the Quezon City Chamber of Commerce took its rudimentary form. But it was through selfless contributions from individuals throughout the years that took the Filipino-Chinese Chamber of Commerce Quezon City (FCCCQC) to where it stands today.

Mr. Chua Hao Ku, as the 6th and 7th Chamber president, saw to the purchasing of land for the establishment of Chamber office and school. During the time of Mr. Ku's successor, Mr. Chua Tiek Yen, the office was built, which served as venue for important events such as member registration, tax seminars, and conflict resolution. When Mr. Leonardo Ty took over office, the Chamber had most of its business in order, hence the committee decided to focus on building a school.

It was not until the next term, when Mr. Alfredo Matti, after countless persuasions and negotiations that the Chamber was able to purchase a license from the Chinese Institute with ten thousand Pesos, and with the approval of Department of Education, Philippine Chinese Institute of Quezon City was officially established in 1964 with the goal of continuing Chinese culture through the education of Chinese descendants, thus fulfilling Mr. Matti's desire of nurturing the children of Filipino-Chinese businessmen to receive Chinese education.

Even though Philippine Chinese Institute of Quezon City started with only the elementary school, it had more than a hundred students in its first year and had the honor to recruit Mr. Tan Chiu Zong as its first principal. Classes were conducted in both English and Chinese, in a two-floor wooden building next to the Chamber office. The building was simple and small, but it was a harbinger of something great to come.

In its fledgling years, it was through the leadership of principals Mr. Tan Hua Yen, Mr. Sia Bun Ming, Mr. Yu Ching Yeng, and Mr. Fang Zhi Xu in 1968 that the school operations grew stable, the faculty expanded, and the quality of English-Chinese education improved. All this was made possible by efforts from School Board of Trustees chairman Mr. Dee Tian Kai and trustee Mr. Lee Ong Tian, and outside contributors. PE and extra-curricular activities took place in a warehouse borrowed from chairman Dee and Mr. Chua Bun Kwan single-handedly provided the funds to start the kindergarten department and later the high school department.

Just when the school was on the verge of great expansion, misfortune happened in June of 1971. On the eve of the school opening day, a massive fire devoured and destroyed the school. Once again, chairman Dee Tian Kai and the rest of the Board had to start from scratch. In 1974, the Philippine Chinese Institute of Quezon City was officially renamed the Philippine Institute of Quezon City (PIQC). After few years of difficult yet successful rebuilding, just when the school had once again started to expand, another fire struck in October of 1976. A nearby blaze spread to the school and the Chamber office. Documents and files were lost, including chronicles of all the directors and graduates, and all photographs of teachers and students. This was a time of unparalleled crisis for the school and for the near a thousand of students. President Mariano Chua of Chamber took upon himself the responsibility of ensuring uninterrupted education for the students while orchestrating a rebuilding of the school.

With the moral and financial support of Mr. Ong King, Mr. Carlos Cruz, and Mr. Tee Yeng Hok, the school was able to set up a temporary campus on nearby Williams Building Christian Church and Our Lady of Loreto Church to continue operations. In order to rebuild the campus quickly, the Board of Directors organized a building committee headed by Mr. Alfredo Matti as chair, and Mr. Chua Se Kiong, Mr. Carlos Cruz, and Mr. Go So Dy as vice chairs. The committee hired director Alfredo Young as contractor, who began construction even before funds were completely raised, which were generous contributions from Board members and several philanthropists in the community. Within a short span of six months, a four-story concrete building was erected, a testament to the Filipino-Chinese virtue of perseverance through adversity.

After the school was rebuilt, three major champions of the rebuilding, Mr. Ong King, Mr. Carlos Cruz, and Mr. Tee Yeng Hok were elected in succession as the 11th, 12th, 13th, 14th and 15th chairmen of the Board. During that

period, the number of students again increased to a thousand. Unfortunately, principal Fang Zhi Xu left due to health reasons and Chamber president Ong King took on the role as interim principal. Later, Tee Ah Sim, Sy Tiok Bi, Sia Sun Dee, and Jose Chua were hired to handle academic affairs while trustee Agustin Lao became the acting principal who reported to the Department of Education. Then finally, the school appointed as principal Mrs. Rita Wang-Chua, who further fortified the academic strength of the school.

The next stage in the growth of school was the result of the vision of the 26th Chamber president Chua Se Kiong. He believed that further expansion would be untenable without buying our own land, and so president Chua, with the support of School Founder Alfredo Matti and directors Carlos Cruz, Mariano Chua, Tee Yeng Hiok, Agustin Lao, and Hao Se Pieng started raising funds to purchase a neighboring lot. With contributions from business tycoon Dr. Lucio Tan and many others, director Alfredo Young again took over construction and a majestic five-story building was erected.

By the time the 32nd president, Mr. Agustin Lao and the 19th chairman, Mr. O Pan Suy took office, the school organization was well-established. Seamless cooperation among different organizational levels within helped established a great reputation for the school. In 1990, when Mr. Agustin Lao was chairman of the Board, study tours for school personnel led by trustees Alfredo Matti, Agustin Lao, Tiu Guan, and Ting Tiok Din visited the cradle of Chinese civilization. They toured schools in Beijing, Nanjing, Shanghai, Ningbo, Hangzhou, Guilin, and Hong Kong to further their knowledge on different aspects of the Chinese culture, a first among all Chinese schools in the country.

During the school's 30th anniversary, a welfare fund for school personnel was established to provide better benefits. When Chamber president Benjamin Chua took office, he focused on advancing the school to the next level. With the guidance of Ms. Ku Siu Bin and the leadership of a succession of Chamber presidents, Sy Sun Chiong, Benjamin Chua, Francis Chua, Jose Choa and Alfonso Siy, and Board chairmen Tiu Guan, Tan Sio Yan, John K.C. Ng and Yuckyin Garcia, the school campus underwent a massive upgrade. Auditorium, audio-visual room and library were renovated and new educational equipment, a computer room, and a playground were added. When Mr. Francis Chua became president of Chamber, he established funds for campus constructions, computer teaching, and employee retirement. When Ms. Yuckyin Garcia became chairwoman and principal, the school celebrated its 40th anniversary. Through the auspices of Chamber and school Board members, the kindergarten, student restrooms, principal's office and faculty office were renovated. Their contributions also enabled the establishment of several scholarships with the aim of helping under-privileged students. After Chairwoman Garcia's term, Ms. Lee Shu Hwei became the new principal with Ms. Angelin Tan as the assistant principal.

As the school advances towards its 50th anniversary, it has at its helm Chamber presidents Mr. Jose Balonan, Mr. William Gosiaco, Mr. Angel Ngu, Mr. Franklin Soriano, Mr. Yap Cho Ty, Mr. Alberto Aquilino; chairmen Guillermo Chutick, Mr. Johnny Ng Chua, Mr. David Chua, Mr. Leonardo Matti, Mr. Hao Ping Hong and Ms. Liza Lim. Under their supervision, the school has

seen the establishment of more scholarships and an overhaul of teaching methods with additional resources allocated for English instruction. Additional funds were raised for construction of a new elevator, a new building with chemistry laboratories, office spaces for the kindergarten department, a playground, and renovation of sanitary facilities.

Our school is extremely fortunate to continue to have the guidance and support of visionary Dr. Lucio Tan and the many Board members who constantly work for betterment of the school. This continuous support is most appreciated when one sees the next generation of Board members, Mr. Leonardo Matti, Mr. Johnny Chua, Ms. Liza Lim, Mr. David Chua and Mr. William Gosiaco, continuing the work of their parents Mr. Alfredo Matti, Mr. Chua Tiong Pieng, Mr. Agustin Lao, a Mr. Benjamin Chua and Mr. Sy Sun Chiong, all past Chamber presidents. They understand the hardships endured by people before them, and yet they fling themselves selflessly and tirelessly into the hard work that is education.

The passion for education has always been the heritable source of inspiration and strength for the school; it is the momentum that carries the school towards its goals of preserving the Chinese tradition while keeping up with the times and educating students to be responsible members of the Filipino society. This same passion has also inspired a great showing of support from the growing alumni base. For the 50th anniversary, alumni celebrated their Alma Mater's birthday with a massive homecoming to strengthen the alumni core. From this core will come the next generation of leaders who will carry on the task of growing PIQC.

It has been fifty years since the founding of PIQC. Under the leadership of current principal Ms. Lee Shu Hwei and her emphasis on revolutionizing education, our school is able to keep up with the times through participation in local and international professional training for our teachers, and the promotion of e-learning for our students. Teachers and office staff fulfill their responsibilities, labouring tirelessly day and night. The school expects our teachers to adapt a modern philosophy of teaching, emphasizing respects for students' individuality (personality, attitude, background, temperament, and academic achievement), as well as specialized and professional training. More concretely speaking, the school expects teachers to have a sincere attitude and meaningful teaching strategies, as well as to treat the students as subjects themselves. These are accomplished through proper classroom management, creative methods, and flexible teaching styles, in keeping with the school's policy of discipline and self-improvement. With the perseverance and dedication of all involved, may our school achieve the goal of being the center of advancement in Chinese culture and arts, as well as in science and technology.

The Philippine Institute of Quezon City marches on in history. Twice it was burned down, with the loss of twenty years' worth of documents related to the federation and the school. With much research attempts at recollecting facts, still a lot of information gaps exist in our school's history. With regards to the latter thirty years, too many important people are involved so that it is impossible to enumerate them all. It is inevitable that people or facts be overlooked in this account, and so we cordially seek your help in correcting us.

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
