3. Competition Site and Equipment

3.1. Competition Site

Judo competition will take place in Jiading Gymnasium which is located in the north-west of Shanghai, 30km away from downtown and has a seating capacity of 3,000. The Gymnasium has two standard judo courts. VIP area will be reserved.

3.2. Competition Equipment

“Taishan Brand” tatamis made in Shandong, China which are produced in conformity with IJF Regulations will be used in the competition.

Electric timing and scoreboards in conformity with IJF Rules, “Eagle Brand” scales made in Shanghai, China will be used in the competition.

4. Training Sites and Equipment

4.1. Two courts in the gymnasium of Shanghai University of Science and Technology will be used for training.

4.2. Tatamis used for training will be identical with that to be used in the competition.

4.3. A court on the ground floor of the Weiqi Hall at the west side of the Jiading Gymnasium will be used for warming-up.

5. Check—In

5.1. A check-in desk will be set up on the ground floor in the west hall of the Gymnasium. Competitors are requested to report to the check-in desk with their AD cards 15-minutes in advance prepared for the competition.

5.2. Referees shall check the competition suits during check—in. The suits must be in conformity with IJF Regulations.

5.3. Any delayed check-in may result in disqualification from the competition.

5.4. Competitors shall follow the referee to enter the competition area.

6. Athletes and VIP Rooms

Rooms for athletes are on the 2nd floor of the Weiqi Hall, which is at the west of the Gymnasium. VIP Room is in the south side of the Gymnasium.

7. Accommodations

Athletes will be accommodated in Jiading Hotel. Meals will be supplied in self-service system. Restaurants are on the 1st floor of the Hotel. Muslim food will be served in a seperate restaurant on the second floor.

Meal boxes may be ordered at the Hotel Meal Service no later than 18:00 the day before. The ordered boxes will be ready for the team to collect after breakfast.

Free soft drinks are available at the competition and training venues.

8. Transportation

The Organizing Committee will provide transportation for the teams to ensure that the athletes and officials will reach the venues in time for competition, training or attending as spectators. Please read the Transportation Information for details.

Vehicles for hire will be available. Details may be found in the Transportation Information.

Transportation for delegation officials, VIPs, technical delegates, technical officials and journalists will be provided. Please refer to the Reception Information for details.

9. Medical Services

There will be 24-hour medical service in the designated Hotel. First-aid stations will operate at the competition and training sites for emergency service.

11. Confirmation of Participation

11.1. Preliminary entry forms (by event and number) sent by member NOCs, must reach the Shanghai East Asian Games Organizing Committee (SEAGOC) no later than 24:00 hours (Beijing time), January 9, 1993.

11.2. Final entry forms (by event and number) must be received by the SEAGOC no later than 24:00 hours (Beijing time), April 9, 1993. Changes or additional entries received after the deadline will not be accepted.

12. Weighing—In, Sauna Bath and Draw

12.1. Weigh in

Competitors in each weight category may use the official scales on the morning of their respective competitions from 6:00–7:00 hours and will be officially weighed from 7:00–8:00 hours under the supervision of 2 technical delegates designated by the JUA. After roll call, the competitors will be weighed once only. The competitors must make the appropriate weight for their respective categories on this weigh-in. Failure in this will be regarded as forfeiture.

12.2. Sauna bath

There will be one sauna bath each for men and women in the Jiading Gymnasium.

Opening time: 09:00-12:00

14:00-18:00

Extra hour during the competition dates 21:00-22:00

12.3. Draw

12.3.1. The draw for all categories including both men's and women's events will take place at 14:00-hours on May 13, 1993 under the supervision of the technical delegates. A maximum of two official delegates for each participating member NOC may attend the draw.

12.3.2. The four medal winners (one gold, one silver and two bronze medalists) in each category of the 1991 World Championships or the 1992 Olympic Games will be seeded before the draw, if they participate in the same category.

13. Technical Meeting

A technical meeting will be held at 9:00 o'clock on May 13th, 1993. (Information will be further provided.)

14. Press

14.1. Seats for journalists will be reserved in the Gymnasium. Journalists will need special passes for access to the competition area. Flashlights are prohibited during the competitions.

14.2. Press conferences for the winners will be held 10 minutes after the finals of each category at the Sub-Press Center.

15. Victory Ceremony

15.1. Victory ceremony will be held according to the working project drawn up by the Organizing Committee.

15.2. Victory ceremony will be held in assigned areas after the competition of each category.

15.3. The top three winners shall wait at the assigned place in their team uniforms or traditional costumes ready for the ceremony.

15.4. The victory ceremony will be announced both in English and Chinese.

15.5. The order of victory ceremony will be:

- Playing of fanfare music
- Announcement of the opening of the ceremony
- Winners march-in
- Announcement of results
- Awarding and presenting flowers
- Flag-raising and playing of anthem
- Medalists march-off

16. Doping Control

Doping control test will be conducted during the Shanghai East Asian Games' Judo competition in accordance with the relevant regulations of the OCA Medical Committee and the International Judo Federation. The method and number of athletes to undergo doping test

will be agreed upon by the SEAGOC and the Coordination Committee of the East Asian NOCs.

17. Femininity Control

According to the IJF Regulations, femininity control tests will be conducted by the Medical Department and relevant professional organization with internationally-approved techniques. Athletes who have obtained valid femininity certificates issued by the Medical Committee of IOC, the international Sports Federations or the Organizing Committee (or its Medical Committee) of Continental Games may be exempted from the tests.

18. Protests

18.1. Protest should be handed in by the team leader in written form within 30 minutes after the competition together with a protest fee of 50 US dollars or other equivalent.

18.2. Protest will be dealt with by the Judo Jury of Appeal of the 1st East Asian Games authorized by JUA and the Judo Commission of SEAGOC. Their decisions will be final.

18.3. The protest fee will be refunded if the protest is accepted.

19. Other Matters Concerning Competition

19.1. Training facilities

Training facilities will be provided in the Jiading Gymnasium and Gymnasium of Shanghai University of Science and Technology. Training will be arranged according to the training schedule.

19.2. Competition results

Competition result will be announced in time and provided for the teams to collect.

20. Accreditation Cards

Accreditation Cards will be issued to all the registered athletes and officials upon their arrival for their access to the venues and the designated Hotel, and for using the facilities. The accreditation cards must be carried at all times during the Games. Any loss of the AD cards must be reported immediately to the security departments.
