前 言

自從去年出版『TOEFL 英語命題突破』一書後，匆匆已歷一載，這其間也經常接獲出版社轉來熱心讀者的信函，其中佔大部份的讀者都要求能夠加重Section I Listening Comprehension 的單元部份，以與『TOEFL英語』一書相輔相成。原以為Section I 的聽力理解 (Listening Comprehension) 部份，實非短時間內可以培養成的，而須經日積月累的訓練，與 Section II 的 Structure and Written Expression 及 Section III 的 Reading Comprehension and Vocabulary 單元可以短時間內依靠自習得分有所不同。由於大部份讀者的企盼以及亞太圖書出版社的願予促成，這本『TOEFL 試題集』才能順利予以付梓。

本書的編輯過程是把相當於過去四年份試題中的所有資料，作一全面性的檢討，並將試題內容的質與量相類似的予以歸納整理。在這一段編輯期間內，凡有關從美國各大學所送來的資料及文獻，也都一一整理過目。如此一來，讀者們對於有關 TOEFL 考試問題中的命題趨勢與標準及 Reading 的由來，都將會有更深一層的認識與了解，因此本書的出版，深信能給予 TOEFL 考試的應試者最新的指針與信心。

本書的利用方法與解答方法

【TOEFL 試題集】——在考前給予應考者一份如同實際測驗情況的模擬試題。就量的方面而言，從問題的提示開始、考試時間及各單元部份的試題份量，以及就質的方面，從試題所採擇的內容和題目的種類來說，都逼近於實際的 TOEFL 考試之方式。在試題的形式上，本書擇取自1976年以來，大約10年間 TOEFL 考題的命題傾向作了一番整理研究，並與近年的試題內容作了一番比較，因此本書的模擬試題，在形式上可說是最新的，在培養應考實力上可說是最有效率的。每一 TEST 各有一卷錄音卡帶，以使讀者如同身臨 TOEFL 考試之現場。

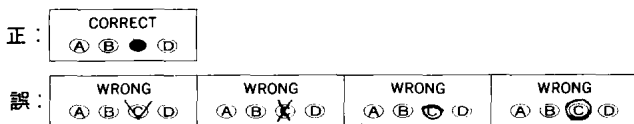
• 時間與內容

• 解答方法

- (1)Section 1 ~ 3 的每一單元，必須在規定的時間內完成作答。
