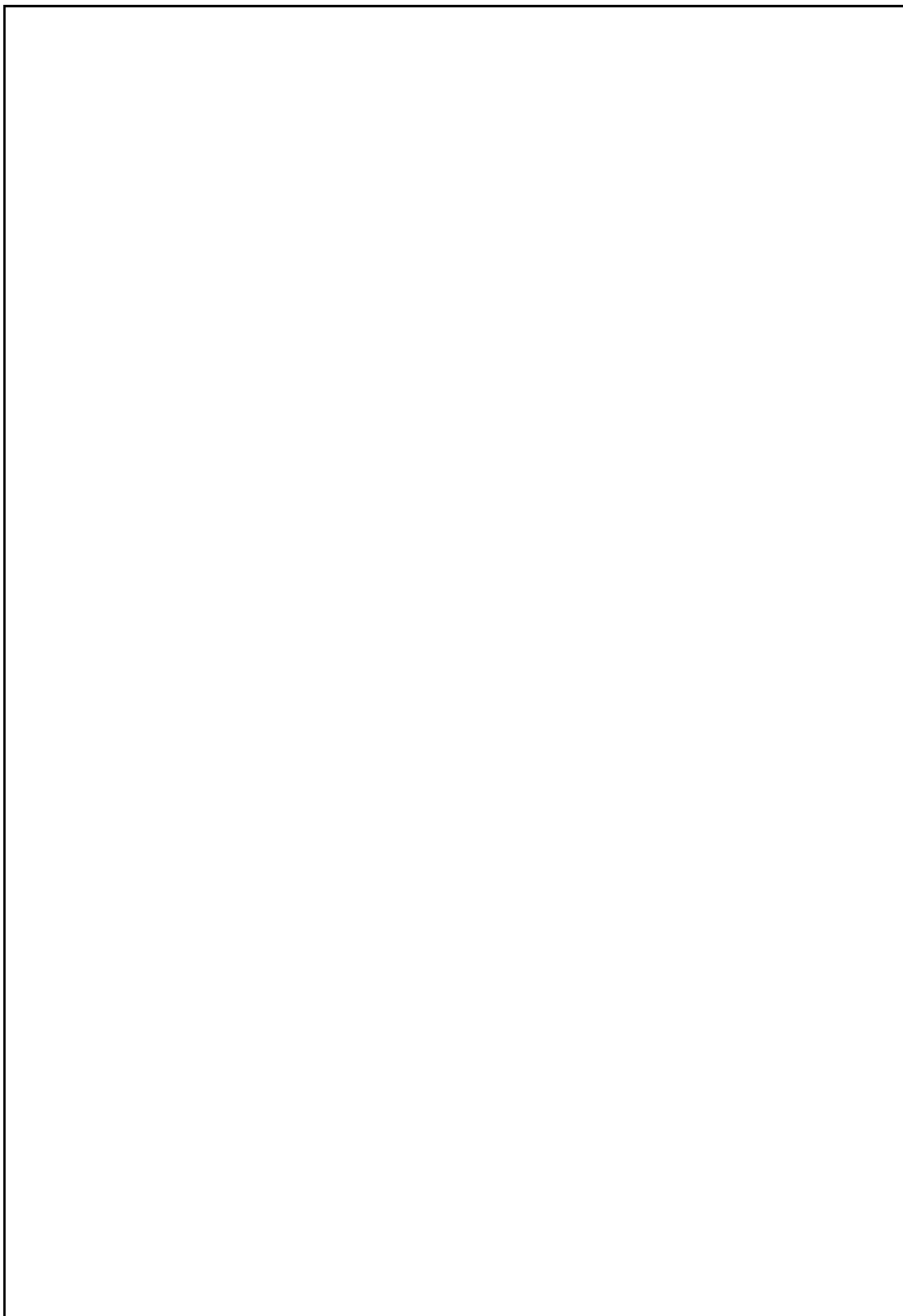

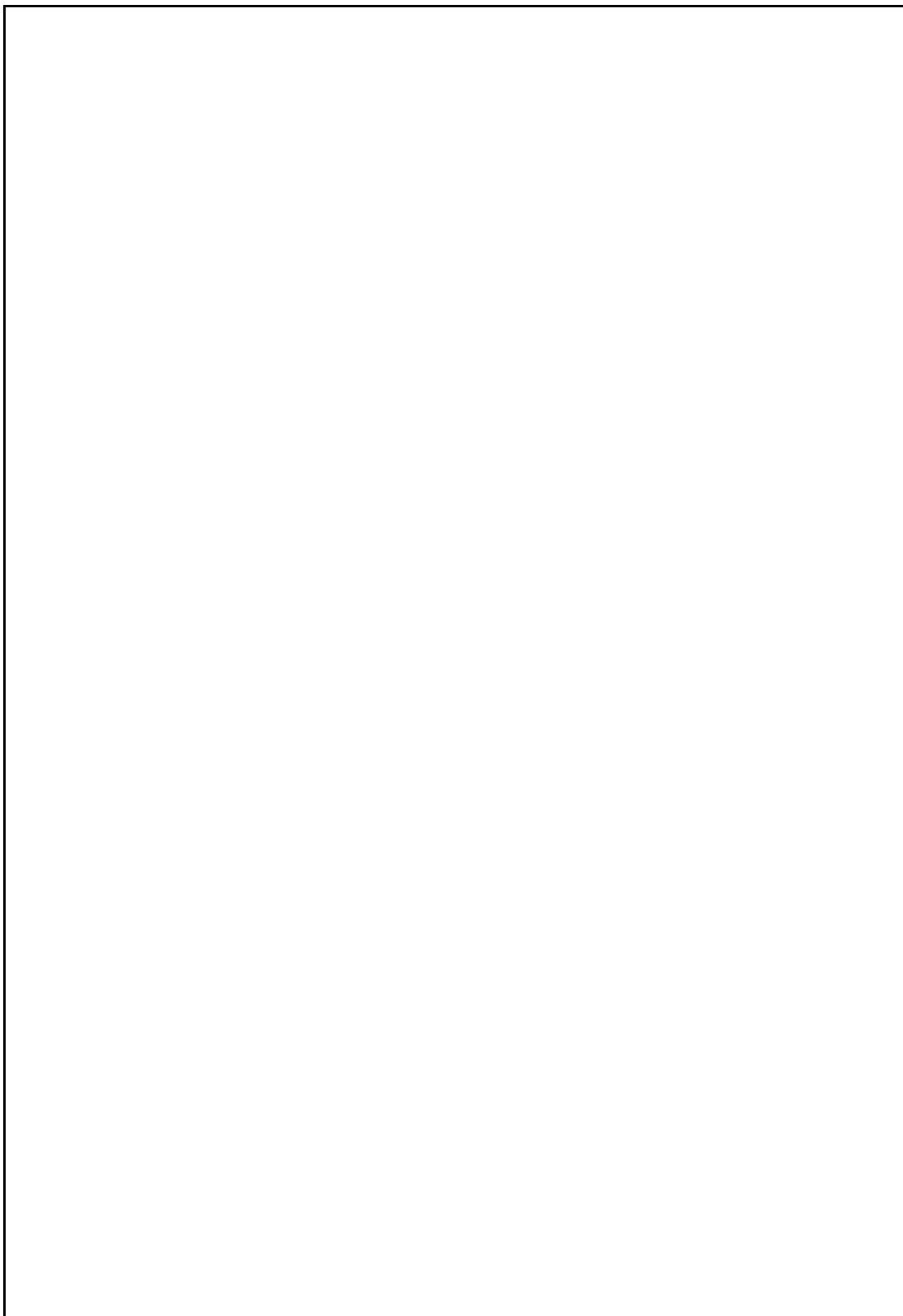

Have you ever thought about volunteer work? Have you ever participated in some? Why would you want to devote your precious time to a job that does not pay you anything?

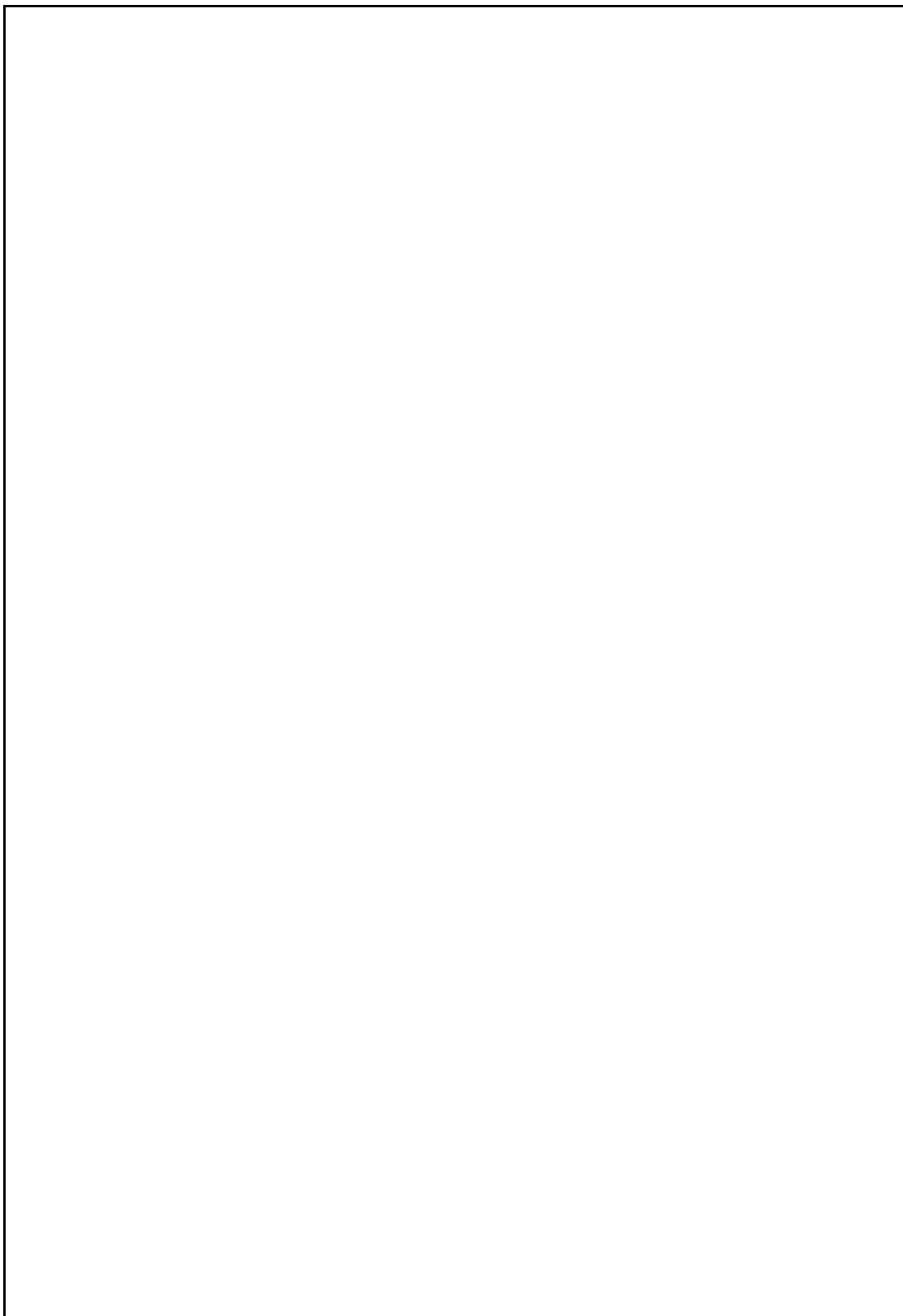
