# 大学英语精读分级同步测试

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### 前 言

为配合《大学英语(文理科)》精读教材,加强平时教学,帮助学生更好地掌握并消化学习的重点和难点,我们设计了这本与《大学英语(文理科)》精读教材各单元同步的成绩考试册(Achievement Test),供课堂教学的单元测试或学生自学使用。本书的每套试题均以对应单元中与本级或四级考试直接相关的常用单词、短语、句型、语法和构词等内容为命题要素,并设计了教材中没有、但与四级考试题型相同的多项选择完型填空和短文阅读理解,以帮助学生尽早熟悉全国四、六级考试题型,达到四级所规定的语言运用能力。

成绩考试也称学业考试,它作为检查、评估学生学习成绩的手段, 能有效地帮助学习者复习、巩固语言学习的重点和难点,进而强化、发 展其语言知识和技能。

近年来,为了提高全国四、六级考试通过率,不少高校,尤其是 非重点院校,往往过早过多地使用高难度的测试材料给学生进行考前 题海强化,但大多由于学生基本功不扎实而收效甚微。本试题册的设 计以基础知识的巩固、深化为主旨,将是考前热身训练的必要准备和 铺垫,也是通向四、六级考试成功的标梁。

本书初稿于 1993 年成稿后,曾在华东地区多所高校中作为《大学 英语(文理科)》精读的配套教材使用,受到师生们的广泛好评,其编 写思想和体例得到了充分的肯定。

这次,我们结合使用中的反馈信息,对本书的初稿进行了全方位的系统修订后正式出版,以满足更多读者的要求。

修订稿主要有以下诸特点:

- 一、词汇部分更紧扣精读课本和新颁布的大学英语教学大纲 4000 《通用词汇表》。
  - 二、语法结构更系统、选择项更合理、替换了初稿中太易、太难

或命题内容有重复、选择项有争议的试题。

三、完型填空和阅读理解短文在题材上更贴近相应单元的精读课 文,其难度更适中、选择项更科学。

四、翻译题更体现了"由简而难、由短而长"的原则,很好地为写作"由句向段"的过渡作好了铺垫。

五、写作仍保留了初稿中"由段向篇"的逐渐过渡,但其命题更接近了全国四级考试的新题型,全部范文由美籍专家 Joy C. Hilbun 女士审阅,因而其语言更地道、更具范例的作用。

六、第四级每套试题中增补了 10 道词汇题,以使该级的题量、题型与前三级完全相同。新增试题的命题内容多为短语动词,以与该册精读教材的编写思想相吻合。

全书分上、下两册。上册为第一、二级,配精读教材第一、二册; 下册为第三、四级,配精读教材第三、四册。答案和作文范文另册装 订。

参加本书编写的教师来自江苏省内十二所高校。

作为本书的续篇,配合新颁布的 4000《通用词汇表》和即将实施的四级考试新题型而编写的《大学英语新编四级模拟试题集》也将于近期出版。可与本书配套使用。

全书由吴玮翔同志和 Joy C. Hilbun 女士定稿并主审。

由于编写时间仓促,书中不够成熟之处仍在所难免,恳望专家同 行不吝赐教,以期下次再版时修正。


