前 言

本书为英语分类幽默集,所收录的既有幽默故事,也有其他较为 常见的幽默形式。

幽默故事有的"笑点"完全基于语言本身,有的是对趣味事件或人物的描述。我们将前者归为语言类,后者归为非语言类。语言类幽默按其涉及的语言本身各层面分为拼写、语音、词汇(短语)、句法、语篇、语用等几个类别;非语言类幽默所涉及的内容包罗万象,我们以人为主线,收录职业、种族、男女、老人、儿童等主要类别,并特别收录英语幽默故事中十分常见的"金发女郎"和"酒吧"两个幽默类别。

非故事类幽默我们除收录谜语(Riddles)外,重点收录英语中特有且常见,但汉语中没有的"灯泡类"(Light bulb jokes)和"敲门类"(Knock-knock jokes)等幽默类别。此外,我们还收录了关于英语语言和西方人(美国人)的一些趣味"发现"。

语言类幽默和(我们所收集的)谜语类及"敲门类"幽默基于语言本身,涉及语言各层面,有助于读者增强对英语语言的敏感性和体会英语语言之妙。(以人为主线的)非语言类幽默和"灯泡类"幽默,则反映出英美人对特定类别人群的一般认识,此类幽默也是读者了解英美文化的一个窗口。常见于儿童之间相互逗趣的"敲门类"幽默可使读者了解英语中特有的幽默类别,并享受一定的童趣。

Professor Smith was going to meet his students on the next day, so he wrote some words on the blackboard which read as follows: "Professor Tom will meet the class tomorrow."


A student, seeing his chance to display his sense of humor after reading the notice, walked up and erased the "c" in the word "class."

The Chinese says, "That was the Japanese, I'm Chinese."


The Jew says, "Well, you have black hair, squinted eyes, and buckteeth, it's all the same to me."



The fairy replies, "Surely you will have heard of Fairy Nuff $^{\mathbb{O}}$."


You're Welcome
