

EDITOR'S NOTE





"Peking Man".


The site of "Peking Man" dating back 500,000 years.






A 180-mm-high coloured pottery pot of the Yangshao Culture 6,000 years ago.

A huge vault containing life-size terracotta figurines and horses buried in the tomb of the First Emperor of the Qin Dynasty (259-210 B.C.).







A Tang Dynasty 663-mm-high tricoloured pottery camel carrying three musicians.

"Flying Celestials and Hunting" - a mural in No. 249 Cave of the Dunhuang Grottoes, dating back to the Western Wei (535-56).




The Guyang Cave of the Longmen Grottoes in Henan Province, carved at the end of the 5th century.





The Zhaozhou Bridge in Zhaoxian County, Hebei Province, built in 605-17, is the oldest stone arch bridge still in use today.






The Great Wall — one of the architectural wonders of the world.






The 8,848.13-metre-high Mount Qomolangma, the world's highest peak, on the Sino-Nepalese border.




The Sisters' Pool (above), and the Lake of Sun and Moon (below) in the Ali Mountains, Taiwan Province.






Rippling sea of sand, Taklimakan Desert, northwest China.
