Preface

The manufacture of abbreviations is one of the largest and fastest growing industries in the world today. Wartime is generally a great period o growth, but the tremendous extension in the development of technology has caused the last two decades to be boom years. The rate of growth is so high that it is possible that hundreds of abbreviations of all kinds in the fields of science, economics and administration alone have been created daily in the Western world. Many of them may never be known outside their own circles; many may be discarded and many may soon be forgotten. My principal task in this new compilation, therefore, has been to provide a representative selection of the old and the new (omitting the potentially ephemeral) to serve the purposes of the student and scholar, the administrator, the business man, the exporter and the community of the general reader at home and at work.

To produce this dictionary of abbreviations it has been necessary to communicate with a large number of organizations throughout the world; and I have recorded the abbreviations substantially in the style in which I have received or otherwise collected them.

This has demonstrated that the modern practice of omitting from abbreviations the full point (period) continues to grow, and it is particularly true in military and data processing terms. The unpointed style, too, may be used for advertising or for bold headings while the pointed is kept for more formal use; but on the whole the inconsistency of usage is noticeable, particularly in the names of institutions and organizations, even when a pronounceable style of abbreviation is accepted. The North Atlantic Treaty Organization, for example, can be found variously in official publications as NATO, NATO, N.A.T.O. Pointed and unpointed styles of all categories, not necessarily organizations, are grouped separately in this dictionary. Correspondingly, single letter abbreviations or symbols which may occur in small letters or capitals, pointed or unpointed, are placed in separate groups. The reader who does not find an entry in one group should look in another, in most cases adjoining.

Some organizations including the professions and government departments specify an official abbreviation for a particular word, yet a variant of the official may be found in general or common use. Where this happens and space permits I have shown both styles, and identified the official one.

I have not, however, attempted to dictate a single correct style when several styles can be used by the same organization. I have sought to incorporate abbreviations (contractions, shortened forms, initials and their variants), and symbols (the conventional signs of the arts and the sciences) from as many fields of global activity as is possible within the practical limits of a book of some 200,000 words. Everyday abbreviations in common currency have their places here, but special emphasis has been placed on economic and commercial matters including particularly employers' associations and trade union organizations. The proliferation of the acronym, a pronounceable name of convenience formed of initial letters of organizations, etc. e.g. Oxfam, Ensa or of parts of words, e.g. radar, radio detection and ranging, has been a marked feature of twentiethcentury abbreviation and many examples are given here. The acronymous title is indeed so highly valued that the title of an organization may well be formulated from the several letters of an apposite word describing its interest or function.

The Dictionary contains around 25,000 entries with a total of over 37,000 definitions, many extended by explanations.

A dictionary that has to deal with any aspect of the technical terms and speech of an innovating society must necessarily be a growing concern, and I will be grateful to readers for suggestions for the improvement and extension of the present work.

Entries and Definitions

This dictionary contains abbreviations of different kinds and alphabetical signs and symbols. The term abbreviations includes contracted and shortened forms of words and phrases, and acronyms and initials.

All entry headings are printed in bold type and are arranged in strict alphabetical order. Those with lower-case (small) letters in roman (ordinary) type come before those with roman capital or small letters. Headings without full points (periods) come before those with full points. The following order of 'C' is an example:

ca, cA, Ca, CA, ca., Ca., c.a, c.a., c.A., C.a., C.A, CA., C.A.

Subordinate modifications include accents, hyphens and obliques such as că, ca', ca, c,a, c,a, c and a, c & a, and are followed by entries containing numbers, as ca, ca, ca, ca, ca, and ca/3. Signs based on letters of the alphabet or numerals e.g. @, £, % and foreign type characters come after the modifications. Entries prefixed by a numeral appear in the alphabetical sequence of the first letter following the numeral.

Headings which require the use of italic type for words and phrases not naturalized in English follow the corresponding roman type entry.

The common practice of omitting the full point after the last letter of a contracted form, if it is the last letter of the word, is not followed in the dictionary. It is to be understood therefore that unpointed contractions are here advisedly so printed. Signs and symbols do not necessarily carry the initial letters of the words they stand for, and are unpointed.

In definitions small letters are used for common nouns in preference to capital letters if either form is admissible. Capitals are used for 'proper names', all words written with a capital initial letter. Plurals formed by the addition of 's' have not usually been regarded, but abnormal formations may be given. A single tense only of verb abbreviations is defined.

The heading is followed by a simple definition, preceded in the case of languages other than English by the name of the language involved, the definition in that language in italics, and translation into English unless

it is unnecessary. To save repetition of the word 'or', an oblique sign is used to indicate alternative definitions. The definition may be supplemented by a phrase or sentence of explanation or (in brackets) a subject reference such as chem., mus., or naut., the country of origin or use, or a cross-reference to a related entry.
