

New or Revised Rules

The NFHS Basketball Rules Committee always keeps the following basic objectives before it:

- Fair play so that neither team gains an unfair advantage
- A balance between offense and defense
- Careful definitions of words and expressions
- Keep rules brief and concise
- Avoid exceptions
- Have simple statements
- Properly codify
- Write rules that are proper for level of play
- Minimizing risks to participants
- Use of fundamental statements.

These objectives can only be realized as long as the rules are administered as written and without exception. To set aside a rule which benefits one team or the other.

This simplified and illustrated book is a supplement to the basketball rules book and other materials which are designed to make officiating and coaching easier through uniformity of interpretations and rulings, and standardization of mechanics for game administration.

The rules are based upon sound fundamentals and axioms which make it possible for those studying them to apply certain basic principles rather than resorting to rote memory in the study and teaching of rules. Hundreds of administrators, coaches and officials have contributed to the logical development of the NFHS basketball rules.



The NFHS Basketball Rules Committee annually considers many items which were submitted as potential changes or revisions. The items which secured favorable endorsement are listed on the previous page of this book. The majority of illustrations in Part I show these additions and revisions. These illustrations are intended to answer the obvious questions which are raised in regard to the new rules.

When possible, some illustrations are presented to cover the "Points of Emphasis" identified by the committee. In some cases, a future rule change may have to be enacted in response to this problem area.


The illustrations found in Part II of this book have been edited to reflect any changes or clarifications as directed by the committee. Recent interpretations have been added to keep the contents current.

NOTE: Unless specifically indicated, all illustrations involve a two-point try and not a three-point try. When applicable, Team A always refers to the team in possession of the ball. Team B refers to the defensive team.






2-12-4; 5-11-2 The warning horn for a 30-second time-out will now be sounded with 15 seconds remaining.






2-12-5; 10-5-3 The interval to replace a disqualified or injured player, or a player directed to leave the game, has changed to 20 seconds. A warning horn will be sounded with 15 seconds remaining in the interval (five seconds into the interval).





4-15-4d; 9-5-2 The definition of when a dribble ends was changed to when the loss of control by the dribbler is caused by the opponent touching, or being touched by, the ball rather than an intentional batting of the ball.



4-42-5 The word "legally" was added to the definition of when a throw-in ends. The previous rule could possibly reward a defensive team for committing a violation, especially during an AP throw-in.





3-4-6b New The implementation date has been reached requiring the home team to wear white jerseys.





3-5-2 & New d Guards, casts, braces and compression sleeves must be worn for medical reasons.
