

3 The Syllable Game

The Rules

- A: You need to play this game with a partner. The winner is the player who gets the most points.
- B: To win points, you must make a straight line of four or more squares. The line can be horizontal, vertical or diagonal.
- C: To make a line you must win the squares that are next to each other. You can win a square by throwing the dice. If the dice shows 1 or 4, you can win any square with a 1-syllable word in it. If the dice shows 2 or 5, you can win any square with a 2-syllable word in it. If the dice shows 3 or 6, you can win any square with a 3-syllable word in it.
- D: Players must take turns to throw the dice and win squares. When you win a square, draw your symbol X or 0 in the square.
- E: When all the squares are full, count your points; four points for every line of four squares, five points for every line of five squares, and six points for every line of six squares.

Martin




