Introduction

Aim. The object of *Walford's guide to reference material* is to provide a signpost to reference books and bibliographies published mainly in recent years. International in scope, but with an English-language emphasis, the Guide is intended for librarians, in the building up and revision of reference library stock; for use in general and special library enquiry work; as an aid to students taking examinations in librarianship; and for research workers, in the initial stages of research.

Coverage. The 4th edition of the *Guide*, planned for publication over a 6-year period, will, as previously, comprise:

v.1: *Science and technology*. 1980.

v.2: *Social and historical sciences, philosophy and religion*. 1982.

v.3: *Generalia, language and literature, the arts*

Some subjects have a divided allegiance, and the policy in this work is to concentrate at a given place, or at two places, with a few exceptions, rather than to scatter according to viewpoint. It does mean that the user may have to refer to more than one volume for the full range of a subject. Thus, military, naval air force matters are dealt with at both 355 (in v.2) and 623.1 (v.1); economic and business affairs, at both 33 (in v.2) and 65 (v.1). Volume 3 will include a cumulated subject index.

Volume 2: Social and historical sciences, philosophy and religion has main entries for some 5,000 items, plus c.2,000 subsumed entries — an increase of about 10% on the 3rd edition of v.2 (1975), even allowing for excisions. Some of the subjects highlighted are: minorities, industrial relations, women and society, social services, the European Economic Community, Parliament, education, aspects of less-developed countries, primary historical sources, and British local history.

An appreciable amount of older reference material is now available as reprints, and these items are represented. As previously, announcements of forthcoming works or volumes are inserted. 'Hidden' bibliographies appearing in periodicals or as parts of books continue to find a place, as do entries for leading reviewing journals (eg, *The Economic journal*, *History*).

To help provide more critical annotations, comments from a variety of reviewing journals, both general and special, have been quoted.

When two prices are given for a work, the cheaper is for the paperback edition. Prices are

normally those given in *British books in print, 1980, Books in print, 1980/81*, and the French and German equivalents. US prices and distributors are cited for the first time.

Acknowledgements. Joan M. Harvey has taken over the compilation of entries on social sciences (general), statistics, economics and trade (ie, sub-classes 3, 31, 33, 38/382). L. J. Taylor has helped in updating entries, adding US prices and furnishing the index. I am also indebted to a number of subject specialists for help and advice, and, since this volume includes annotations carried forward from previous editions, I am once again beholden to those who then assisted me. Accessions lists of general and special libraries were used in quantity as checklists, for both titles and locations. Most of the items listed have been examined by the editor.

The philosopher's index: a retrospective index to U.S. publications from 1940 (1978. 3v. \$195) includes entries for c.15,000 articles and c.6,000 books, 1940-76.

'Philosopher's index' data base covers international philosophical periodicals, 1967-, and U.S. philosophical periodicals, 1940-.

Copious cross-references. V.8 has a detailed subject index (p.387-54), with c. 40,000 entries.

Articles are scholarly but readable. Physically the volumes are also pleasing, with large, attractive print and stout paper. Histoire de la philosophie. Période chrétienne, by F.van Steenberghen (Louvain, Publications Universitaires, 1964. 196p.), is by the Professor of Mediaeval Philosophy, Louvain Univ. Period covered ranges from end of 5th century to end of 12th; pt.3 deals with Arabic philosophy. The bibliography (p.181-6) notes both sources for research work and items for further reading.

J.R. Weinberg's *A short history of medieval philosophy* (Princeton, N.J., Princeton Univ. Press, 1964. ix, 304p.) is considered by *Philosophical review* (v.75, no.3, July 1966, p.407-9) to be a work of first-rate scholarship and something of a classic. Selective bibliography, p.295-300.

An appendix gives contents lists of separate volumes of the 'Proceedings' for the pre-1900 period (ie, 1887-96), for 1900-49, and for 1950-53. Covers a wide range of aspects of philosophy. Considered 'a major new tool for the subject, an indexing and abstracting service' (Staveley, R. *Notes on subject bibliography* (1959), p.34).

Index Aristotelicus, by H. Bonitz, is part of v.5 (1870) of the K. Preuss Akademie der Wissenschaften's edition of Aristotle's works (Berlin, Reimer; reprinted Graz, Akademische Druck- und Verlagsanstalt, 1955. vi, 878p.).
