



Dialogue

Cliff Look, this is you at the piano. And who's this with you?

Narration


Cliff shows Brian a photo of him at the piano. He asks Brian about the boy who is with him.



Brian That's my brother Robert. I was fourteen then. I played the piano then, not the organ.

Brian says it's his brother Robert, and adds that he was fourteen when the photo was taken and he played the piano, not the organ, then.
