## PREFACE

THIS volume, published under the direction of the Department of International Studies of the London School of Economics and Political Science, embodies an attempt to present in collected form a selection of the decisions bearing upon points of public international law which have been given by national and international courts and tribunals during the years 1925 and 1926. The work of which this book is the first-fruits was prompted by the suspicion that there is more international law already in existence and daily accumulating "than this world dreams of" and by the conviction that it is more international law that this world wants. As the work has progressed that suspicion has ripened into a certainty. Every student of international law is familiar with the summaries and reports of decisions which are to be found in Series E of the Publications of the Permanent Court of International Justice, including its very useful analytical indexes, and in such periodicals as the *British Year Book of International Law*, the *American Journal of International Law*, the *Journal du Droit International*, the *Zeitschrift für Internationales Recht*, the *Rivista di Diritto Internazionale*, and many others, to which our indebtedness is patent and is gratefully acknowledged. When to these familiar and accessible sources are added the decisions of many courts and tribunals, national and international, which do not usually fall within the scope of periodical publications, the resulting mass of raw material forms a body of authority which both in quality and in variety has exceeded our expectations. If we now can, with the help of collaborators, carry out our purpose of applying the same method to decisions given in the years 1919 to 1924 inclusive and in the years subsequent to those covered by this volume, there will soon be available for practitioners and publicists a

series of volumes which, we venture to think, will become increasingly useful as the years pass by. The feature of the twentieth century, particularly after the year 1919, is likely to be an abundant growth of judicial activity in international relations, and there is little reason to doubt that, before half that century has elapsed, international law will be developed from judicial sources almost out of recognition.

A discussion of the degree of authority and the law-making influence to be attributed to decisions such as are digested in this volume would be out of place here, and we shall confine ourselves to the remark that in any field of human activity it is impossible for one mind faced with the task of solving a problem not to give weight to the solution of a similar problem which has commended itself to another mind elsewhere. That is not a principle of law but of common human experience.

Not every civilised country is represented in this volume, but the lack of any digest coming from a particular country does not mean that it has been overlooked. In spite of the valuable assistance of Judge Altamira, Professor J. M. Trias, and Senor Juan de Callejon, no relevant Spanish entries for the years 1925 and 1926 could be found, and the Baltic States yielded up nothing to the search so courteously made on our behalf by Professor Piip. Finland also provided no cases for this volume. In Turkey there exists, we are given to understand, some official objection to the publication of judgments to others than the parties concerned in the litigation. We are also indebted to Dr. G. Kaeckenbeek, President of the Upper Silesian Mixed Arbitral Tribunal, to Dr. S. Rundstein of the Polish Foreign Office, and to Professor C. van Vollenhoven, Presiding Commissioner of the American-Mexican General Claims Commission, for materials which they have been so kind as to send us.

It will be seen that as a general rule we have contented ourselves with a bare statement of the facts and a summary of the judgment in each case and have not attempted to criticise it or to add references to similar decisions or relevant literature. A vertical line by the side of an entry indicates that the decision emanates from an international tribunal, and the judgments and advisory opinions of the Permanent

Court of International Justice are distinguished by the use of large type and by printing the name of the Court in the margin.

To our contributors, British and foreign, we are deeply indebted for their labour, which in the case of many countries (notably the United States of America) has been heavy, for their zeal in co-operating in this experiment which has been most stimulating, and for their toleration of the editorial discretion. Although it would have shortened our task to preserve the *ipsissima verba* of their contributions, we came early to the conclusion that it was necessary to maintain a certain measure of common form throughout the volume, particularly in view of the fact that many of the digests were coming from countries in which the form of a digest is not so familiar as it is to British and American lawyers. We therefore have not scrupled to modify the text of the contributions when required for this purpose. We have also frequently found it necessary to omit digests supplied by them of decisions which turned upon points of internal constitutional law and did not illustrate or develop a principle of international law; though occasionally the presence in such cases of certain features of interest to international lawyers has seemed to us to justify their inclusion. We must beg the indulgence of our contributors for any liberties which we may have taken and must ask our readers not to attribute to them too literal a responsibility for the selection or the contents of the digests ascribed to them in this volume. The notes appended to certain digests are the work of the contributors except when they are followed by the letters: "Ed."

The members of our Advisory Committee have been to us an unfailing source of help, not only in the work of planning out the classification but in finding contributors and in advising upon the acceptance or rejection of decisions and upon the form of the entries. Our task has been longer and at times more tedious than we anticipated at the outset, and it has been a constant encouragement to us that men so much occupied with affairs of public importance as the members of our Advisory Committee should have thought it worth while to spare time to help us. Here again we must acquit them of

responsibility for the contents of the volume or the views implied by the classification or expressed in the notes, because there are many points upon which we had to exercise our own judgment. This exoneration is rendered particularly important by reason of the official positions which they occupy.

To the Governors and the Director of the London School of Economics and Political Science, and to Messrs. Longmans, Green and Co., we are grateful for the far-sighted public spirit which has made it possible to produce a work upon which the financial return may be somewhat delayed, and for their patience in awaiting its publication. We have also to thank Miss Lucy Mair, M.A., Assistant Lecturer at the London School of Economics and Political Science, for translating a number of the digests and for assistance in reading proofs. To the printers we are indebted for the interest which they have shewn in devising an appropriate form.

In conclusion, we wish to make it clear that we regard this volume as experimental. That something like it is essential we are convinced, but on the questions both of form and contents we shall welcome criticism and suggestions from any quarter.
