Approximately 30,000 men were arrested and dragged off to concentration camps during the pogroms on 9/10 November 1938.












Eichmann, standing in front of his house and talking to the stranger, had no suspicions.






Also taken with the briefcase camera: Eichmann's son Dieter (*above*) and daughterin-law Margarita, wife of Klaus Eichmann (*left*).

Hidden under the tarpaulin of this lorry (*right*), Zvi Aharoni observed Eichmann's house (*below*).












Eichmann as a prisoner. The thickly covered goggles were to prevent him being able to identify his kidnappers (*above*).
