## Preface to the Second Edition

For a number of years, the usefulness of Gale's Acronyms, Initialisms, and Abbreviations Dictionary has been augmented by a companion volume, Reverse Acronyms, Initialisms, and Abbreviations Dictionary, in which the same entries are arranged alphabetically by meaning of the abbreviation.

It was felt that users of International Acronyms, Initialisms, and Abbreviations Dictionary (IAIAD) would also find a similar rearrangement of terms helpful, and the result is this edition of Reverse International Acronyms, Initialisms, and Abbreviations Dictionary (RIAIAD).

#### **International Series Comprises Three Volumes**

As Volume 3 of the International series, RIAIAD lists the same 110,000 terms as Volume 1 (IAIAD), but access is through the meaning of the abbreviation, rather than the abbreviation itself. Volume 2, New International Acronyms, Initialisms, and Abbreviations, consists of two interedition supplements to the main volumes. Each of these supplements is comprised of two sections: By Acronym and By Meaning, thus incorporating features of both IAIAD and RIAIAD by providing two ways to access the terms.

#### What Is Covered?

Reverse International Acronyms, Initialisms, and Abbreviations Dictionary contains the same entries as IAIAD. The major criterion for inclusion is that a term be clearly international in scope or be continental, regional, national, or local to a foreign area. Because AIAD includes British and Canadian terms, they are excluded from IAIAD and RIAIAD (unless they have international significance).

Over 150 countries are represented. The majority of terms are of current interest, but historical entries are also included. The range of subjects covered is virtually unlimited and includes societies; military terms, political parties, trade and commerce terms, labor unions, government units, research centers, nuclear energy terms, and thousands of commonly abbreviated words in nearly two dozen languages.

#### Compilation and Format

Entries in this series were compiled from a variety of published sources, miscellaneous newspaper and newsmagazine references, lists provided by foreign consulates, government publications, terms provided by outside contributors, and independent research by the editorial staff.

In many cases, sources gave the meanings of terms in the original languages, often accompanied by English translations. Other sources, however, provided only the English meaning for a foreign-language acronym or initialism. A given term, therefore, might appear either under its original language or under its English translation:

#### **Major Sources Cited**

Each term from a major published source is followed by a parenthetical alphabetic code in small capitals. In the examples above, for instance, "(IN)" refers to Reference Aid: Glossary of Indonesian

Abbreviations and Acronyms and "(RU)" to Glossary of Russian Abbreviations and Acronyms. For the user's convenience, a key to these symbols can be found on the end sheets. In addition, complete bibliographical information about the publications cited is given in the List of Sources Cited.

#### **Need for a Guide Evident**

Foreign acronyms and abbreviations are created in at least as great a variety of ways as are their English counterparts. The most common procedure in any language is simply to use the initial letters of major words in a term:

Agencia del Ministerio Publico ...... AMP

Sometimes, however, all words in a term are represented in the initialism, including articles, prepositions, etc.:

izba Kontroli Rachunkowej Poczty i Telekomunikacji ..... IKRPiT

Or, the first syllables or a part of each word, rather than initial letters, are used to form the acronym:

Cooperative des Producteur du Riz au Burundi ...... COPRORIBU

Frequently, foreign terms that are particularly long are shortened by representing only the first several words:

Yet another method uses only selected words, often the first and last, to create a telescoped form:

These and other intricate variations on the simple creation of an acronym or initialism make essential a guide such as Reverse International Acronyms, Initialisms, and Abbreviations Dictionary.

As political, economic, and cultural interdependence among nations continues to grow, *RIAIAD* will increasingly eliminate guesswork and tiresome searches by providing acceptable abbreviated forms quickly and accurately in a wide range of languages and subjects.

Comments and suggestions are welcome.

#### **Editorial Policies**

A typical entry would provide the foreign-language word or phrase, its English translation, identification of the language or country of origin, a source code, and the foreign abbreviation. Many entries, however, do not contain all these elements; the completeness of a listing is dependent upon the information provided by the source.

Many entries are without English translations, and others consist only of the English expansion of the foreign acronym. It is felt, however, that even partial information will be helpful to a user and, consequently, as noted in the preface, a given term might appear either under its original language or under its English translation. If additional information or a translation becomes available in future research, an entry will be revised.

#### Special Characters, Transliteration

It was recognized at an early stage of compilation that complete consistency would be an elusive goal. *RIAIAD* includes a multitude of languages, and sources vary in form and treatment of entries. As a result, most terms have been picked up exactly as given by the cited source.

Font limitations preclude the typesetting of diacritics, ligatures, and so forth. Where possible, however, affected letters have been altered according to accepted standards. (The German für became fuer, for example.)

Not surprisingly, various sources reflect differing systems or philosophies of transliteration. No attempt has been made to alter the original entries by applying a single system of transliteration. The potpourri of languages and sources represented makes complete consistency of treatment impossible. It is felt, however, that since *RIAIAD* is aimed at a general audience rather than linguistic specialists, the simpler course will serve the needs of the general user satisfactorily.

#### **Arrangement of Terms**

Terms are arranged alphabetically in word-by-word sequence according to the *meaning* of the acronym, initialism, or abbreviation. If a particular meaning has more than one initialism representing it, the various choices are then subarranged alphabetically, letter-by-letter, as they are in Volume 1 (IAIAD).

Neither ampersands, articles, conjunctions, nor prepositions are considered in the alphabetizing; hyphenated terms are treated as separate words. Material within brackets, such as English translations, subject categories, or explanations, is not considered in alphabetizing.

Entries containing digits follow the basic form of the phrase, but precede all alphabetic forms; entries in which the number is spelled out are filed alphabetically, Roman numerals are filed as letters.
