The era of developing therapeutic progress is with us now, somewhat as the era of developing descriptive medicine was with us in the earlier part of the century.

It is our hope that, the diagnosis once made and the etiologic agent determined, the physician will be able to use this book for quick, yet detailed, orientation to a currently practiced and accepted therapeutic approach.
