Over 100 nations and nationalities live and work in the USSR.

In the steady process of drawing closer together all Soviet nations, strengthen of their fraternal friendship and unity the Russian language plays an important role. On the basis of the 1979 census 153.5 million people called Russian as their mother-tongue of whom 137.2 million are Russians and 16.3 million are other nationalities. Besides, 61.3 million people stated that they had free complete command of Russian as their second language. Thus, 82 per cent of the USSR population know the Russian language as their mother-tongue.

In the USSR there are two friendly classes: the working class and the collective-farm peasantry. Intelligentsia (brain workers) makes up a considerable part of the population. In 1939 about 13 million people were engaged mainly in mental labour but at the present time their number is over 42 million.

¹ Co-operated handcraftsmen, i.e., the members of small producers' artels of co-operation including non-working dependants made up 2.3 per cent of total population in 1939. Beginning with 1959 they have been transferred to the system of state enterprises and accounted as workers and employees.
