## PREFACE -

This book is intended for intermediate learners of EST or English majors who desire to develop their ability of interpretation both in daily life and foreign trade.

Interpretation is a course of listening, remembering, organizing and expressing. All the exercises in this book are designed based on the above course.

This book contains 10 units. Each unit is divided into 2 chapters.

Each chapter 1 of the units, takes up the topics we frequently talk about in our daily life, including the exercises of listening comprehension, conversation and interpretation. The primary purpose is to get the learners to speak English about a variety of subjects and build up a good solid foundation for improving their ability of interpretation.

Each chapter 2 of the units, is grouped together roughly in terms of related subjects according to the whole course of foreign trade. From establishing trade relations, ... ordering... packing ... agency to telexes and telegrams, the exercises of general idea, practical sentences and interpretation help the learners master the general knowledge of foreign trade. What is the most important is to improve the learners' ability to communicate in English with others in the field of foreign economic relations and trade.

Most of the exercises have been designed so short that they can be performed within class. Many interpretations in different practical

situations have been put in this book, making learning English more interesting and enjoyable. The diversity of the exercises makes the texts adaptable to a broad spectrum of students.

Finally, all of the exercises are supposed to be done orally without looking at the originals in this book. Learning interpretation takes time, but it can be fun, too. It can be an effective way to understand other people and their cultures better or develop one's own ability better.

This book is designed to be a useful adventure in interpretation of foreign trade so as to enable the students to keep pace with the recent development.
