Gives a general picture of the May 15th Incident. In short, it shows how those men connected with the Incident were Army and Navy officers in active service and in possession of the latest weapons. Gives detailed particulars of the Incident from beginning to end--assasination of the Premier Inukai, threatening of Makino, Lord Keeper of the Privy Seal, firing on the Metropolitan Police station, attempt to darken the city, etc.

Histories of various men in the Incident. Such men as Dr. OKAWA, Shiumei, and others are pointed out as being the men who were responsible for planting the seeds of the Incident. The document also gives or names the origins of the Civilian troops engaged in it: AIGO JUKU, SHIZAN JUKU, SHIMBUKAI and the TENOKAI.)

Pamphlet is collection of articles dealing with various topics. Most significant among articles is that of TANAKA. entitled "True State of March and October Events," beginning p. 109. Following is taken from this article:

March Event (1931)

- 1. Establishment of Sakura-Kai (Cherry Society) during later part of Sept, 1930 (association of patriotic officers),
- 2. Organized by HASHIMOTO, SAKATA, HIGUCHI, and others, totaling about 20.

Purpose 3.

a. Reconstruct a glorious Japan even though

On 8 April the undersigned interviewed FURENO. Inscale at Sugara Frison in an attempt to lean which of the principal defendants he might know well enough to give information of value to the cases against them. (Interview conducted in English).

Statements in FURUNO's file (#218) indicate he was very close to TOJO and was consulted by TOJO on all matters of propaganda. (Da commliance with orders not to interview anyone re TOJO, this relationship was not discussed).

Statements in EURUNO's file indicate a close relationship with HOSHING. Nacki. (After consulation with attorneys interested in HOSHING. this relationship will be discussed at a future interview).

FUNDING stated that he was ffiendly with the following principal dependents in varying degrees of intimacy:

HASHIMOTO, Kingero, Colonel OKAWA, Shumei, Dr. SUZUKI. Telichi MITO. Akira

SATO. Kenryo ITAGARI. Seishiro. General OKA. Takasumi

SUMMARY OF EVIDENTIARY FACTS

MADE BY TANAKA, Ryukichi, in booket entitled "Probing the Osuse of Defeat". Document 780.

TANAKA mentions a plan proposed by OKAWA to put an end to the Chinese Incident. He suggested a barter deal with the United States giving Japan iron and gasoline which would be a severe blow to Chinese fighting spirit and would thus bring about an end to the Incident. TOJO opposed this plan.
