#### PREFACE

The development of international economic relations within the framework of macro and micro-economy has rapidly changed its structure from its classic conservatism to modern liberalism and from national-oriented economy to transnational-oriented economy since the World War II. The way to create a new world economic order was reflected from the signature of a series of multilateral treaties of economic cooperation. The multilateral treaties replaced traditional bilateral economic cooperation through various forms of economic and trade treaties, which is a basic treaty of friendship, commerce and navigation or the treaties of establishment. Nevertheless, the creation of post-war international economic organizations within the UN specialized agencies framework demonstrated the decisive factor to thrust previous international relationship into a new international economic relationship. Thus international economic organizations multiplied in appearance in modern international law.

The creation of the first international trade organization in 1946 was the first attempt to legalize transnational trade transaction through international law. The signing of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) on 30 October 1947 and the establishment of International Monetary Fund, the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development and other international organizations of an economic and financial nature accelerated the development of international institutional law and infused new blood into the creation of regional economic organizations. The establishment of European Economic Community (EEC) in 1957 was another revolutionary step towards the accelerating expansion of regional economic organizations, which provides the legal basis. Therefore, upon inspection, many other regional economic organizations, such as Central and Latin American regional economic organizations as well as those of Africa, have mostly imitated the structure, management and operation from the EEC model.

After the dissolution of the U.S.S.R. in 1991, traditional division of European regionalism was transformed into new one—yesterday's Eastern Europe now became Central or Southeast Europe, while Central Asia was politically cut off from old Tsar's Empire. New regional and sub-regional identity came out and a new concept of solidarity was therefore formulated. Numerous regional and sub-regional organizations as well as different forms of economic cooperation such as alliances, initiatives, programmes, etc. emerged. Within the framework of international institutional law, regional organizations play a vital role in the formation of modern international economic law. Needless to say, there are several highly praised publications of international institution law or international organizations, but we have to recognize the reality that there are hardly any books on the law of regional economic organizations, and only a handful of books published by French authors under the title of international economic organizations/institutions.

At times, regional economic organizations are treated in public, international law as a chapter and most of them are included in the work of international economic law. From time to time, there are certain selected topics of a sub-branch of international economic law, such as international financial law, international monetary law, or international trade law, which deal with important regional economic organizations. Quite often, the legal perspectives and other important issues of regional economic organizations are analyzed in details in a single book that examines a particular regional economic organization. In this respect, the legal, political, economic, and social aspects of the European Economic Community and the European Union are widely discussed.

Other sources of regional economic organizations mostly derive from the most influential articles published by notable authors. With paucity of reference materials on new regional and sub-regional economic organizations in Asia, Africa and Central and Latin America, we have to rely on the information

provided by official websites networks, which, I would say is a fantastic instrument to collect latest updated information on activities of regional economic organizations.

The purpose of writing this book is to fill that big gap. This book is the first publication ever presented in the academic world that intends to introduce, analyze and act as a supplement to solve the inadequacy of public international law and international economic law, in particular. It is an undeniable fact that regional economic organizations have played, in particle a role to exert considerable influence on regional and international politics and economy as well as social development.

Writing such a book has been on my mind for several years. Several years ago, I once spoke to Prof. Cheng Chia-Jui, one of the most highly qualified scholar in international economic law, who positively encouraged me to write such a book in its present form. He helped me without any reservation in each stage of my writing and read my manuscript carefully and corrected the mistakes made. Without him, the book could never have been born. I owe him not simply like a student towards a professor, but also as a colleague to a colleague, and lastly, for a certain lasting friendship in my life.
