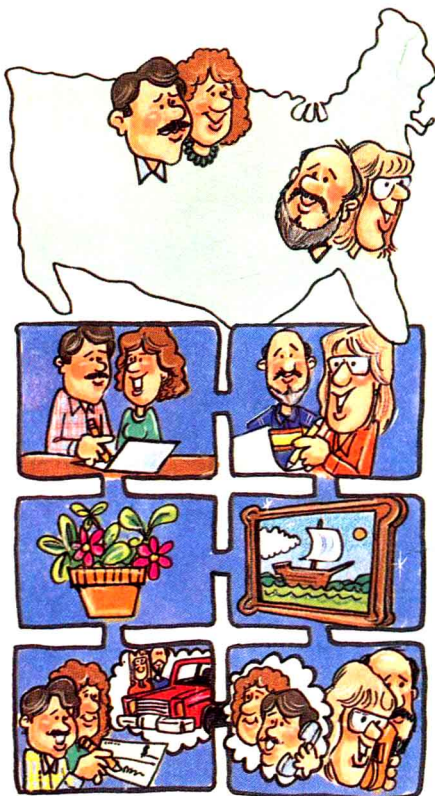


VERY GOOD FRIENDS: EAST AND WEST
