#### COMMENT

PRISONERS OF WAR:

DEMOBILIZATION OFFICE INVESTIGATES DISPOSAL OF PERSONAL BELONGINGS OF ALLIED PRISONERS OF WAR BY ORDER OF SCAP

Writer requests the addressee, formerly a master sergeant attached to headquarters of East Area Army, to report immediately on the disposal of personal belongings, especially identification tags, watches, rings, money, notebooks and photographs, which belonged to the crews of the Allied Forces planes downed in Japan during the war. The addressee is especially referred to the order issued on 10 Jan 46 by 1st Lt. Nelson BUDLER of Communication Unit of SCAP which requests the return of personal belongings of 2nd Lt. Darwin T. EMILY, one of the crew of B-29 bombers downed at Hiyoshi near Mahara, Chiba Prefecture. The order also states that the Army unit which received the crew member transferred the said personal belongings to chief of Mahara Detachment of Kempei tai who in turn transferred them to chief of Chiba Kempei tai.

Writer also encloses a report by UZAWA Shoichi, former chief of Mohara Detachment, which verifies the fact that the articles were transferred to chief of Chiba Kempei tai. Two other enclosed reports by YAMANO Hisao, former Chief of Chiba Kempei tai, and OTANI Keijiro, former commander of East Area Army Kempei tai, show

that the articles were transferred by steps to Patrol Section of East Area Army Headquarters. The addressee is referred to these reports and is requested to report in detail how such belongings of Allied Army plane crews were disposed of during his duty at the East Area Army Headquarters.

JAPANESE PRISONER TREATED KINDLY IN HAWAII

Writer states:

"I was taken prisoner while fighting in a jungle on Saipan and brought here to Hawaii, in July, 1944. It was reported at home that all had died, but in reality some like me are still living. I fought Faithfully, but not blindly, and so when I knew the war was over, I became a prisoner. to live and lead a new life when I comehome.

"Our food is excellent and the bedding is far better than what was provided. the Japanese Army. We have music and motion pictures; indeed, we can enjoy ofer y thing except that we are confined in this place and are not allowed to go

\*The atrocities concerning the American Army are all lies. Americans are all gentlemen and treat us kindly. They say that we can come back to you next summer, and I am looking foward to meeting you then.

He is not permitted to communicate with his family, but I expect he will return home, as all remaining troops there are to be demobilized before long."

PRISONERS OF WAR:

AMERICAN TREATMENT OF JAPANESE PHISONERS OF WAR PRAISED

In a letter to his comrade's wife, writer states:

"I was very much surprised to receive your letter that your husband has not yet returned home from the Leyte island. I havened to meet him at the first internment camp in the Leyte island. There were three thousand soldiers in the camp. American sanitary equipments were so good that no one fell victim to epidemics. During our stay they were very kind and polite to us. We were given plenty of food, such as raisins, milk, sugar, bread and butter, and rice. They granted each of us one bed, a mosquito net, nice uniform and even a razor. We all felt like being a colonel. Our officers had been preaching that we would be killed or treated cruelly. On the contrary, they were so kind that none of us complained of our treatment. We were to help their works but, none of us got slapped. I think it is natural that many Japanese are prosecuted because of their war crime."
