YOSHIDA, Shigera

The following was obtained from a "Country of Information" dated 16 February 1946, on file in the office of the 50th Middenslitan Umit CIC:

In 1927, at the time that Jeda was private secretary to Sarou Temaka, TOSHIDA was Veneul Comerci at Maleica. The Running Army Clique was already plotting the course that was later set in motion by the Momenturian Incident, but YESBIBA was ignorant of these anny medimeticus. He belonged to the old school of diplomate and statemen whose fundamental principle was ecoperation with the United States and Britain. In this respect he was strongly influenced by his father-in-les, Count Makino, generally considered a "liberal" elder statemen. After the February 26 Incident in 1936 Honore told YORKIDA that if Hirota was mesocoaful in forming a gabinet, he would recommend TOSHIDA for Pereign Minister; houses, owing to the eppenition of General Tormshi, YOSMIDA was not given the position, but wen sent instead as ambassador to london.

During this time Veda first same into passession of the startling "Political and Administrative Reform Program" of the "inner group" in the Army. (See memorandum on Secret History of the "Inner Group" in the Japanese Semy from 1927 to 1915, Appendix As dated 25 Movember 1915, File No. 80-1-12.) After studying this secret program of the away redicals for a year, Unia felt it highly important to lay his discoveries before some responsible elder statemen and picked on Count Makino as an influential and likely person. In 1938 he not YOSETBA, who had meanwhile returned from London, and told him of his discoveries. YOUNTDA himself showed little interest or comprehension of the situation but agreed to errouge a meting between mikine and Dede. at this meting, after three hours of explanation by Gods, Makine out him short with the statement that he had heard many people who had such thoses to sall and would have to think the metter over before deciding whether it

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was worth his while to go into it further. Later TOSHIDA informed Useda that Makino considered his information important and would like it reduced to two pages of writing to show in an "important quarter", by which he understood the Emperor, Useda, however, found it impossible to reduce the information to so small a compass, and after writing fifty pages, he sought and obtained another interview with Makino.

On this occasion, Makino listened with greater interest but expressed surprise and incredulity when Ueda named General Harata as having been the moving spirit of the Inner Group, since Makino had a feeling of affection and respect for Nagata. (Ueda described the latter as being comparable to the present Communist leader, Sanno Romain, in the personal love he aroused and in his ability to erests wide confidence through his apparent underation). Probably owing to this fact, Makino never pursued the subject. Ueda continued his investigations and his written history of the Inner Group, conferring from time to time with YOSHIDA, while the Inner Group continued to steer the nation into the disester of war with America. While YOSHIDA was in sympathy with him, according to Ueda. he was both timid and demse in regard to the Army plots which Ueda unfolded to him; he appeared almost afraid to learn too much about these intrigues and sould hear the most startling facts without securing to grasp their significance. Always a diplomat, he slung to a hope in diplomacy despite the fast that the secret Army plan made such a hope unrealistic. Together with his pro-American friends and neighbors, Count Kabayama and Baron Harada, he supported the vain and feeble effort of Emoye to avert war with America. With characteristic unawareness of the real nature of the issues, however, he end his friends remained slessly under the influence of Seihin Ikeda, who was a tool of the Inner Group and is presently hald as a war criminal suspect.

After the outbreak of war, Ueda turned to Monoye with the hope of showing him the true nature of the group controlling the army, and thereby the sountry. Homoye listened to him attentively and grasped quickly the facts which YOSHTOA seemed unwilling to face. Over a considerable length of time, Ueda explained in detail to Monoye the workings and plans of the Inner Group and Monoye became convinced that the Emperor must learn of it. Ueda also "educated" Prince Takamatan as to the actual army situation, and Tahamatan attempted to emlighten his Imperial brother, but the latter reduced to listen to him and oven gave evidence of recenting his "interference". (Then Takamatan was afterwards removed to

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a Newy post away from the capital, Ueda asked him if the Emperor was responsible for having him removed, whereupon Takamateu merely shrugged and smiled). Eventually Emoye was successful in having an audience with the Emperor in February 1945 and in awakening him to the true state of affairs. (See memorandum on Eoneye, Funimare, dated 19 November 1945, File No. 80-K-17.)

Preceding this maddence, Honoye had discussions with YOSHIDA and the members of his group, as well as with Ueda and his close friend and co-investigator, the journalist Tatous Iwabuchi. Repeatedly in these discussions, YCSHIDA showed his continuing unrealism; he still wished to try diplomecy in a situation where diplomacy was useless. At one point he proposed that he and Emmoye should go to Switzerland to inaugurate peace discussions, until Ueda impatiently showed him that such negotiations would be meaningless while the Army was in control of the country and the Inner Group in control of the Army. Even after that, he proposed that someone should be sent to negotiate with Chiang Kei Shek, until it was again pointed out that the domestic situation made such a proposal meaningless. Ecocye himself told the Emperor clearly that the only step which would make peace possible was to purge the Army of the lamer Group. With this plan in mind, and with the Emperor's tacit acquiescence, discussions continued with the aim of forming a cabinet under Konoye to take over after a coup d'etat.

In this cabinet, YOSHIDA was to be Foreign Minister. In his suggestions for other cabinet posts, he once more aboved no discrimination indistinguishing those men who had been in close sympath y with the Army, and on several occasions Ueda quarreled with him over what he considered his stubborn refusal to face facts and free himself from reactionary militarist influences. However, the sabinet mover came into existence, as the proposed coup d'etat was discovered by the Army and on 5 april 1945, YOSHIMA, Beds and Iwabachi were arrested by the Empei Tai, while Enhayams, Harada and o thers were held for questioning and their houses searched. Ueda's own history of the Inner Group, with supplementary documents, was conceeded by his wife and later destroyed by her, she herself being burned to death in one of the air raids while Ueda was imprisoned. He was grilled by the Kampei Tai as to his part in the proposed purge of the Army and was accused of having furnished Kemoye with the data for the latter's andience with the Emperor in Pobruary. The Moupei showed themselves aware of the fact that Moneye had stered with YOSHIDA the night before he sew the Emperor, and they showed Ueda that they had a record of every

visit he had made to YOSHIDA for several years, including photographs of him entering or leaving the house. Usda also learned that all TOSHIDA's servents, including a chauffear inherited from anherseder Grow, were in the employ of the Kompei Tai. The lower Kempei officials who questioned him denied the existence of an Inner Group controlling the Army; the higher officials claimed that the "radical plot" uncarthed by Usda was the work of Usmeral Ishiwara alone and not the Inner Group and that it was the camee of Ishiwara's split with Tojo. As the result of various external pressures, however, TOSHIDA, Usda and Implushi were finally released from prison on May 30.

After his appointment as Foreign "inister in the Higashikuni Cabinet, TOSHIDA found that the situation in the Poreign Office was comparable to an undeclared strike, with the personnel refusing to cooperate with him. Ueda advised him to get rid of the Vice Foreign Minister; as a usual thing, this latter officer actually controls the ministry, having ome up through the burequeratic hierarchy, whereas the Foreign Minister himself is a politically immocent diplomat. With this change accomplished, the work of the Foreign Office again get under way, but Beda considered that YOSHIDA still showed his old reluctance to face issues squarely, see what was going on under his mose, and root out the dangerous reactionary influences in the ministry. When Ueda pointed out the enemaly of having a man like Tetsuo Kawai head the Bureau of Information (see summary of information on Rawai, dated...), TOSHIDA merely spluttered angrily that he was "all right". Then Weda pointed out unsgroury connections between the military and the present Cabinet Secretary Rarchashi, YOSHIDA protested that he was a fine liberal. Then Veda reminded him that Privy Councillor Inema, who exervises the deminent influence in the Shidehare Cabinet, had long and close connections with Tojo and the Inner Group, TOSHIDA refused to face the question. As a result, the relations between the two men began to cool. Momeraile, TOSHIDA remained in intimate association with the other members of the "Ciso Group", -- Kabayama, Harada, and Shun Bomura (Zaibetou member and ardent friend of Seihin Ikoda). These men were "liberal" in foreign affeirs, strongly conservative in domestic affairs, and their present slegan was: "Don't tell the americans too much". Because Voda was of the opinion that the Americans sucht to know the whole history of army and government intrigue in the fullest detail, he was finally estracised by TOSHIDA and the whole Cise Group. However, Iwebuchi was of the epinion that he should make a determined effort to see YOSHIDA again before too long and try to persuade him of the dangers of his present sourse.

Ueda believed that YOSHIDA was still ignorant of many of the important affairs of the Foreign Office, which were directly under the control of the Vice Minister. It was a long established fact that the secret funds of the Foreign Office were entirely under the control of the Vice Minister, who did not have to make an accounting of them. At the precent time, it was common goodly in informed circles that the funds were being used for "propagands" purposes, for subsidizing magazines and journalists; it was missibaid that the Vice-Minister received handsoms "presents" from some of the bemeficiaries of the secret funds. It was possible that two or three million you might be used from this fund for a certain purpose without YOSHIDA's knowing about it. Ueda recalled that when TAMAKA held the office of Poreign Minister concurrently with his premiership, not a single yen of the confidential funds passed through his hands. Since YOSHIDA was a communicat befuddled and incompetent figure at the head of a slick, reactionary burequeracy full of man who had worked hand-in-glove with the Inner Group, it would not be surprising if he was ignorant of much that went on beneath him. One of his elesest advisors in the ministry was Viscount Kene, Vice President of the Liaison Office and a distant relative of YOSHYDA; Kano, as a director of the Yokohama Specie Benk during the war, had had close connections with the military. Under these circumstances. Ueda thought it highly unlikely that YOSHIDA would ever dig out the true facts of the Ba Maw case by investigation, as announced by the Japanese press.

While Ueda's own interpretation of the feets is epen to question, it is believed that he attempts to be scrupulously accurate in his presentation of facts, and it is beyond question that his knowledge of the interrelations between Army and Government Officials is enhaustive. His general thesis about the Inner Group in the Army was recently confirmed by Tomohiko Ushiba, private secretary to Frince Konoye, who showed evidence of being considerably startled when he realized that the Americans knew of the existence of this group and its opposition to the Endo group of General Hamaki. Ueda is shortly to have a political conference with Prince Takamatsu, whom he hopes to see Regent of the country before too long, and is likely to stress to him the need for a purge of the reactionary bureaucracy.
