前言

"美国之音"标准新闻是高校英语专业高年级听力教学中的一项重要内容。根据国家教委颁发的《高等学校英语专业高年级教学大纲》的精神、目标和要求,我们特编写了这本《美国之音标准英语新闻听力教程》,奉献给广大读者,以满足大家的需要。

本书在练习和题型的设计上,依据《大纲》的要求,尽量采用客观性题型:多项选择、正误判断和简单填充;与此同时,还设计了部分主观性题型:回答问题和摘写提要等,以培养学生综合归纳能力和分析推理能力,这样,既注意到了练习题型的灵活多样性,也避免了同类型题的单调性。

为帮助学生更好地听懂每条新闻,进一步扩大知识面,减少听的难度,我们在多数新闻前增加了一定份量的背景知识,供读者参阅。另外,还对一些生词作了英汉注解,以便于读者查阅。

本教材由三部分组成: WORKBOOK, TAPE-SCRIPT 和 SUGGESTED ANSWERS.

Cultural Notes

1. San Jose 圣何塞

San Jose is the capital of Costa Rica, situated in the central tableland of Costa Rica. Founded 1736, it became the capital in 1823. Houses are built low as a precaution against tremors of earthquakes, but in recent years the construction of higher concrete buildings has increased. It is the chief trading center for the country's all—important coffee crop.

2. Costa Rica 哥斯达黎加

Costa Rica is the smallest of the six Central American republics after El Salvador, with an area of 19,475 square miles. Costa Rica is bounded by Nicaragua on the northwest and by Panama on the southeast. Nearly 80 per cent of the population are of pure Spanish descent, the highest percentage of any Central American country. It is a country without an army.

Cultural Notes

1. Organization of the Islamic Conference

伊斯兰会议组织

An Islamic organization established in Jedah, Saudi Arabia, in May 1971, following summits by Muslim heads of state and government in 1969 and by Muslim foreign ministers in 1970. Membership extends to more than 40 states.

The conference aims at promoting Islamic solidarity by coordinating social, economic, scientific, and cultural activities. Under the banner of strengthening the struggle of Muslims, the conference pledges to climinate racial segregation and discrimination, especially in regard to the PLO. Projects include the International Islamic News Agency, the Islamic Solidarity Fund, and the World Center for Islamic Educa-

tion. Egypt was suspended in 1979 after it signed the agreement known as the Camp David accords with Israel; in 1984 it accepted an offer to rejoin the organization.

2. Karachi 卡拉奇

Karachi is the largest city and port of Pakistan and formerly its capital, located in the province of Sind on the western edge of Indus Delta, near the southern base of the Kirthar mountain range. Its population is about 3,100,000.
