前言

大学英语四级考试是教育部(原国家教委)组织的全国性的标准化考试。自1987以来已经进行了十几年。它成为科学地检查大学英语教学大纲落实情况和评估大学英语教学质量的重要手段,有力地促进了大学英语教学改革的深入发展和教学质量的稳步提高,得到了全社会的认可和重视,是衡量大学学生英语水平与能力的重要标准。

由于四级考试的权威性、规范性和其能够正确反映英语水平的客观性,因而受到大学学生以及社会上英语自学人员的普遍重视,有的高校甚至把四级的达标率作为学校教学质量的重要标志。基于这些原因,与十年前相比大学学生英语实际水平有了非常大的提高。虽然如此,通过英语四级考试并非一件容易的事。四级考试是一项综合工程,考生不但要重视英语基础知识的学习,而且要加强学习英语的实践环节。

长期从事大学英语教学与研究发现,学生掌握一定的英语基础知识之后,如语法知识、词汇知识、阅读知识、翻译知识和听力知识等,需要通过一定的实践来巩固和深化所学的东西。基于当前大学外语教学和学习的实际情况,我们认为实践的主要环节来自于有针对性的练习。通过一定量的标准化式题解训练,如词汇、语法训练、阅读理解训练、英译汉训练、改错训练和听力训练等,可以使学生理解、掌握和巩固所学的语法和词汇知识,加强阅读、翻译和听写水平,提高英语的综合运用能力,从而提高英语应试技能。本丛书正是针对英语学习的实践环节需要而设置的,从而指导学生

有的放矢地复习备考。

本系列丛书是根据《大学英语教学大纲》的要求,并参照《大学英语四级考试大纲》和考试委员会最新颁布的四级题型而编写。本套丛书共分五册:《阅读理解》、《词汇与语法结构》、《完形填空》、《英译汉与问题简答》和《听力训练》。通过丛书各个分册学习,对四级考试的各个专项进行强化训练,从而巩固英语基础知识,提高运用英语的基本技能以及增强应试能力。同时,依据教育部考试通知精神,本丛书中的训练题力求有深度、有广度,强调了知识的覆盖面,丛书内容新颖,材料具体实用,充分体现了教学大纲对考试的基本要求,从而使考生达到整理和复习知识的效果。书中材料主要选自英、美报刊时文和各类试题及练习,同时吸收了国内一些有代表性的英语试题。
