## ANNOUNCING *CMDT* ON CD-ROM

In July 1998, a CD-ROM version of *CMDT* was published and in June 2000 a new CD-ROM version of *CMDT 2000* will be available. Besides the *CMDT* text, the CD-ROM incorporates diagnostic test information from the *Pocket Guide to Diagnostic Tests*, 2nd edition, and drug information from the *Pocket Guide to Commonly Prescribed Drugs*, 3rd edition. Photographs of pills and capsules are also included. The *CMDT* CD-ROM incorporates a wide variety of multimedia illustrations, including color photographs, photomicrographs, electrocardiograms, echocardiograms, x-rays, and other diagnostic imaging procedures; graphs, algorithms, and nomograms; video footage of cardiac catheterizations, IUD insertions, and other procedures; heart sounds and lung sounds; and an extensive listing of Internet addresses for each chapter. Finally, MEDLINE abstracts are provided for all journal references in *CMDT* in addition to the last five years of all MEDLINE abstracts available from the National Library of Medicine for the 27 medical journals considered most useful for generalists.
