

- 2、做完练习后检查答案并改正错误。再看一遍 练习题,对你原来不认识的单词或你刚才做 错的习题多加留意。
- 3、5分钟后再次测试, 你可以遮住已填的单词 或请别人提问。重复练习直到你记住所有单 词。
- 4、擦去答案。
- 5、过一天再做一遍。(你应该能记住大部分单词了。)
- 6、最后,在接下来的一个月内再做两遍,这样 所有单词就印在你的脑海中了。
