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## 前言

本手册编写的依据是《硕士研究生入学英语考试大纲》、《大学英语教学大纲通用词汇表》、《非英语专业研究生英语教学大纲及其词汇表》。这三个教学大纲的词汇表是在计算机统计、分析的基础上经过英语教学专家们审核后编写而成的。包括了近六千个常用词、英语词汇及由它们组成的词组。本手册收入了这三个《教学大纲》中的全部词组。此外,编者还根据自己的教学经验和实践,增加了若干常用词组。

本手册由两部分组成。

第一部分为英语词组: I. 动词性词组; I. 非动词性词组。所有词组排列均以英语字母为序;每个词组均给出中文释义并附有两个以上的英语例句。此外,动词性词组还尽可能给出其词汇搭配关系以便读者活学活用。所有例句尽量使用三个《数学大纲》要求掌握的常用词,句子结构比较简单、易懂,便于读者掌握。

第二部分为动词结构搭配。根据编者的教学经验和实践,收入了三个词汇表中结构搭配最积极的常用动词,分门别类说明其结构上的搭配关系。如哪些动词可以要求动名词结构做宾语;哪些动词既可以要求动名词结构做宾语又可要求动词不定式结构做宾语;哪些动词可要求双宾语;哪些动词可要求复合宾语及何种形式的复合宾语等等,并一一举例加以说明。目前采用这种体系编写的辞书尚不多见,我们希望这种尝试能对读者有所帮助。

本手册可供大学本科生、硕士生、博士生和有志于参加全国英语水平考试(WSK)的读者使用,也可供有关教师参考。

由于编者水平有限,本手册难免有不足之处,敬请广大读者不吝赐教。
