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#### 新世纪五星级题库 **高中英语**

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### 前 言

教改趋势及新教材都特别强调学生综合能力的提高,为此,我们在原《题库》的基础上进行再版,推出了符合当前需要的《新世纪题库》,包括《新世纪三星级题库》(分为小学语文、数学2册)、《新世纪四星级题库》和《新世纪五星级题库》(初中、高中各分为语文、数学、英语、物理、化学5册)三个等级,共12册。

《新世纪题库》保留了原《题库》的特色,按各学科的知识点划分单元。 每个单元都安排了大量习题,每道习题都用不同星级标明其难易程度,星级 越高,题目越难。从另一角度看,每一星级也分别代表不同层次的水平和要 求。例如,一星级是测试基本知识、基本技能的题目,最高星级则代表毕业 考、升学考、竞赛等水平。每道习题后还注明了中等水平学生解题所需的大 致时间,供读者解题时掌握、参考。

《新世纪题库》为了适合当前的教改形势,不仅**增加了新题型——能力测试题,**而且**在同一内容的题目中增加一些解题指导,**对难题进行提示,起到举一反三的作用。

《新世纪题库》将有助于广大中小学生有针对性地进行学习和复习,自测解题能力和熟练程度,提高学习效果。同时,它将有利于教师和家长根据需要抽取一定数量的习题组成试卷,对学生进行测试和辅导。

需要强调一下的是,书中每道习题所标出的星级和解题时间,固然是编者在长期教学实践的基础上经过反复推敲而确定的,但由于没有经过大范围的试验,其准确性、科学性难免有所欠缺,更由于读者的情况千差万别,在解题时的感觉可能会有较大差异。所以,这些标出的星级和解题时间只能供参考之用。
