使用说明

本书共分 A、B、C 三级自测练习,测试内容由浅入深,举一反三,覆盖所收词语的重要释义及用法。现将各级测试目的简述如下:

- (1) 自我测试 A 级 (按所收词起首字母排列) 通过成对选择法,检测使用者对所收词语重要释义的掌握程度。 通过英译汉,帮助使用者真正了解所收词语的实际用法。
- (2) 自我测试 B 级 通过多项选择法,检测使用者在有干扰义项情况下对所 收词语的真正了解程度。

通过填词法,检测使用者对所收词语的实际运用能力。

(3) 自我测试 C 级 通过多项选择法,检测使用者在有意思相近或词形相似 的干扰义项下,对所收词语的辨析能力和全面掌握程度。
