编者的话

《大学英语·精读同步词汇练习》是以《大学英语教学大纲通用词汇表 1—4 级》为基础,为配合复旦大学主编的《大学英语·精读》教材而精心编写的具有实用价值的练习册。

本书分 40 个单元,严格与精读数材 (1—4 册) 同步。每个单元有四部分,配有 80 个标准 化选择题。Section A 主要测试被数材编写者收入 New Words 的四级词汇,也包含少数出现在本文又未被收入进 New Words 的四级词汇和四级必考结构,Section B 测试的是超出四级,但在本文又较为重要,而在一般英语文献中使用频率又较高的词汇,它们中多数为 5、6级词汇,Section C 测试的是出现在课文练习中的重要词组和结构,每题题干后括号内的数字表示被测试词组和结构在课文练习中的位置,Section D 测试的是《大学英语数学大纲通用词汇表 1—4级》中那些没有在精读数材 New Words 中出现以及精读课文未能覆盖到的四级词汇。

本书的特点是题量大、测试的词汇面广、针对性强,既可以供教师在教完一篇课文时检查学生的学习情况,也可以供学生四级考试之前强化训练之用。
