前 言

在大学英语四、六级考试中,听力理解部分是广大考生普遍感觉较难又不易迅速提高水平的一项内容,因为听力理解题比较全方位地测试了考生的英语综合能力,它包括了语音、词汇、语法、文化背景知识的掌握以及短时间内的记忆与综合分析的能力。要想真正提高英语听力水平,重要的是打下坚实的语言基础,具备一定的听力技能,同时掌握一些答题技巧。

本书根据"大学英语教学大纲"对听力理解测试的要求,针对大学英语考试中心最新公布的全国大学英语四级考试新题型,并结合长期的教学实践精心编写而成,旨在帮助考生攻克四级考试中的听力难关。

本书对历年来大学英语四级考试听力理解的测试内容进行了认真分析,从实战的立场出发,对听力题型加以归类,并在此基础上总结归纳了许多答题技巧。全书共分三个部分:第一篇为热身练习,共有三套题,后面附有听力原文、答案及解析,并配有磁带。读者可以通过做这部分的练习,检验自己的听力水平,发现存在的问题。第二篇为题型分类及答题技巧。编者对历年四级考试的真题进行认真分析之后,按照对话、短文和复合式听写这三种形式加以分类,并总结出相应的答题技巧。这一部分所举的例子均为历年考试的真题。第三篇为听力模拟试题,共有三套,附有原文、答案及解析,并配有磁带。模拟试题同真题的形式一致。

本书选材内容丰富,难易适中,适用于四级考生及其他达到相同 水平的英语学习者。希望在有效提高英语听力水平方面,本书能助 您一臂之力。
