大学英语六级 听力达标测试

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前 言

四级与六级在听力方面,除了题型有所不同之外,其主要区别在于:

1. 语速不同

四级听力考试中的语速约为每分钟 120 个词, 六级听力考试中的语速约为每分钟 140 个词。

2. 答题时间不同

四级听力考试中每题的答题时间约为 18 秒, 六级听力考试中每题的答题时间约为 15 秒。

3. 文字数不同

四级听力考试中每篇短文字数约为 150 个词, 六级听力考试中每篇短文字数约为 200 个词。

由此看来, 六级听力在难度上有所增加。如果同学们在四级通过以后能坚持进行一两个学期的英语听力方面的训练, 过六级问题不大。但遗憾的是, 多数学校在大二以后就不开英语课了, 不要求同学们过六级。因此, 多数同学把英语放到一边, 直到六级临考前才抓一下, 做几套题, 最后难免败下阵来。

如果立志要过六级,同学们应该在考完四级以后继续保持或 提高听力水平,因为听力是无法通过考前突击训练而得到显著提 高的。

如何保持和提高英语听力?英语听力与众多其他能力一样不进则退,如果英语听力没有最后过关,只要有一段时间没有训练,其能力必定退化,只有当听力大致过关以后,才能保持听力水平。这同游泳、骑车是一个道理。实际上,大学生在通过四级后距最后掌握听力已经不远了,为了避免以后反复参加英语进修班、考前班的学习,同学们应该在过四级后一鼓作气地突破听力关。从眼前看虽然是多花了一点时间,但从长远看,这是最省时间的方法。

如何靠自己的力量通过英语听力关?

通过英语听力关需要做好听力之内和听力之外两个方面的工作,较为重要的是听力之外的工作。所谓听力之内的工作就是去听别人(现场或录音)讲英语,所谓听力之外的工作就是尽量多背一些英语单词、句型、短文、对话,等等。提高听力无疑需要多听,背诵就相当于讲给自己听,其好处是可以提高复述能力,从而为口语能力打下基础。顺便说一句,如果你敢于主动用英语与他人交谈,那么你距过听力关就不远了。我们不必等到过了听力关才去说,而是通过同自己说、同别人说来提高听力。这与一个婴儿学习母语时的情景相似。一个婴儿在向周围的亲人提出要求时,并不十分关注自己的话能否被人听懂或能听懂别人的回答,同样,母亲也不必要等到孩子过了听力关后才与他交流。实际上,许多母亲在孩子尚未出世就开始给孩子唱歌、讲故事了。

因此,做好听力之外的工作是过听力关的基础。与此同时,每隔一段时间用一套听力测试题考查一下自己的进展情况是很有必要的,这也是我们编写这本试题集的目的所在。
