第一章 金版托福听力成语 (带 * 号的是托福已考成语)



across the board 普遍地(全都包括在内)

◆ The President (总统) wanted taxes (税) lowered (降低) across the board.

* act up

- 1. 捣乱;行为粗鲁
- ◆The dog acted up as the postman (邮差) came to the door.
- 2. 出毛病
- ◆ The car acted up because the spark plugs (火花塞) were dirty.

add fuel to the flame 火上加油,使事情更糟

◆ Bob was angry (生气的) with Ted and Ted added fuel to the flame by laughing at (嘲笑) him.

add insult to injury

- 1. 进一步伤人感情
- ◆ He added insult to injury when he called the man a rat (老鼠) after he had already beaten (打) him up.
- 2. 雪上加霜

◆ We started on a picnic (野餐), and first it rained, then to add insult to injury, the car broke down (坏了).

afraid of one's shadow 胆小的;紧张的

- ◆Mrs. Smith won't stay alone (独自) in her house (房子) at night; she is afraid of her own shadow (胆小的).
- ◆ Johnny cries (哭) whenever he must say hello (你好) to an adult (成年人); he is afraid of his own shadow.

after one's own heart 合某人心意的,投合某人的

- ♦ He likes baseball and good food; he is a man after my own heart.
- ◆ Thanks for agreeing with (同意) me about the plan (计划); you're a girl after my own heart.

against the grain 跟…格格不入

◆ His coarse (粗俗的) and rude (粗鲁的) ways (方法) went against the grain with me.

against time or: against the clock

- 1. 尽快地; 以便在某个时间之前完成某事
- ◆ It was a race (竞赛) against the clock whether the doctors would get to the accident (事故现场) soon enough to save (挽救) the injured (受伤的) man.
- 2. 用耗时间来拖延
- ◆ The outlaw (歹徒) talked against time with the sheriff (司法长官), hoping that his gang (一帮同伙) would come and rescue (解救) him.

a hell of a or: one hell of a 极;简直(用来加重语气)

- ◆ Tom said seven months (月) was a hell of a time to have to wait for a simple visa (签证).
- ◆ The fall (跌跤) David took left (留下) one hell of a bruise (青肿, 伤痕) on his knee (膝盖).

all ears 急于倾听的;非常专心的

- ◆Go ahead with your story; we are all ears (急于听的).
- ◆When John told about the UFO (不明飞行物), the boys were all ears (非常专心的).

all eyes 因吃惊或好奇而瞪大眼睛的;(非常)仔细观看的

◆At the circus (马戏或杂技表演) the children were all eyes.

all of a sudden see; all at once

all out 全力以赴地;尽力地;毫不退缩地

- ◆ My classmates (同学) went all out to win the football match (足球赛).
- ◆ John went all out to finish the job and was very tired (疲劳的) afterwards.

all set 准备好

◆"Is the plane (飞机) ready for take - off (起飞)?" the president (总统) asked. "Yes, Sir," the pilot (飞行员) answered. "We're all set."

all systems go 一切准备就绪;可以行动;可以开始

◆ After they wrote out the invitations (邀请), it was all systems go for the wedding (婚礼).

all the thing or: all the rage 流行;时尚;红极一时

- ◆After "The graduate (毕业生)" Dustin Hoffman was all the rage (红极一时) in the movies.
- ◆ It is all the thing to follow movie stars.

all wet 错乱了;大错特错;搞错了

◆ If you think I like baseball, you're all wet.

* and how! (用于强调同意)对; 当然; 那是自然

- ◆"Did you see the game?" "And how!"
- ◆"Isn't Mary pretty?" "And how she is!"

and then some 还要多得多;还更多

◆ It would cost (花费) all the money he had and then some.

answer for

- 1. 负责
- ◆ The secret service has to answer for the safety (安全) of the President and his family (家人).
- 2. 担保;保证
- ◆ When people thought Ray had stolen (偷) the money, the principal (校长) said, "Ray is no thief(贼). I'll answer for him."
- 3. 受到指责或惩罚
- ◆ When Mother found out who ate the cake, Tom had to answer for his mischief (胡闹).

armed to the teeth 全副武装的;武装到牙齿的

- $igoplus The paratroopers (\mathbb{Z})$ were armed to the teeth.
- * around the clock also: the clock around 夜以继日
- ◆ He studied around the clock for his history exam (历史考试).

around-the-clock 昼夜的;二十四小时的

- ◆ That filling station (加油站) has a round-the-clock service (服务).
- * around the corner 即将到来或发生;临近;在近旁
- ◆Christmas (圣诞节) is around the corner.

as luck would have it 碰巧,碰的不巧(视上下文而定)

- ◆ As luck would have it, no one was in the building when the explosion (爆炸) occurred (发生).
- ◆ As luck would have it, there was rain on the day of the picnic (野 餐).

at a loss 困惑;不知所措

- ◆A good salesman (推销员) is never at a loss for words (言辞).
- When Tom missed the last bus, he was at a loss to know what to do.

at any rate 无论如何;不管怎样

- ◆ It isn't much of a car, but at any rate it was not expensive (昂贵的).
- * at hand also: at close hand or: near at hand
- 1. 在手边;在附近

- ◆ When she writes, she always keeps a dictionary (词典) at hand.
- 2. 即将来临
- ◆ Examinations (考试) are past and Commencement Day (毕业典礼的) is at hand.

at heart

- 1. 内心深处;实际上
- ◆ His manners (行为) are rough (粗的) but he is a kind man at heart.
- 2. 挂念
- ◆ He has the welfare (幸福) of the poor at heart.

at large

- 1. 逍遥法外
- ◆The killer (杀人者) remained (仍然是) at large for weeks.
- 2.详细地;全面地
- ◆ They agreed to discuss (讨论) the matter at large.

at one's heels 紧跟随;作为一直的追随者或伙伴

- ◆ John ran by the finish line (终点) with Tom at his heels.
- ◆ Bad luck followed at this heels all his life.

at one's wit's end or: at wits end 不知如何是好;不知所措

◆ The designer (设计者) was at his wit's end; he had tried out methods (方法) of many different kinds, but none would work (奏效).

at pains 尽力;努力

◆At pains to make a good impression (印象), she was prompt (准

时) for her appointment (约会).

at sea 不知如何是好;迷惘;糊涂

- ◆ The job was new to him, and for a few days he was at sea.
- ◆When his friends talked about chemistry (化学), Don was at sea, because he did not study chemistry.

at sixes and sevens 杂乱的;乱七八糟的

- ◆ He apologized (道歉) because his wife was away and the house was at sixes and sevens.
- ◆ Our teacher had just moved (搬入) to a new room, and she was still at sixes and sevens.

at the drop of a hat

- 1. 立即;立刻;迅速地
- ◆ If you need a babysitter (照看婴儿者) quickly, call Lucy, because she can come at the drop of a hat.
- 2. 随时
- ◆ He was quarrelsome (争吵的) and ready to fight (打架) at the drop of a hat.

at the tip of one's tongue or: on the tip of one's tongue

- 1. 在嘴边
- ◆ It was at the tip of my tongue to tell him, when the phone rang.
- ◆ John had a rude (粗鲁的) answer on the tip of his tongue, but he remembered (记起) his manners (行为举止) just in time.
- 2. 话在嘴边却无法准确说出
- igoplus I have his name on the tip of my tongue.



back down or: back off 放弃;让步;退却

◆ Bill said he could beat (打) Ted, but when Ted put up his fists (拳 头) Bill backed down.

back to the wall or; back against the wall

走投无路;陷入很大的麻烦

- lack The team (以) had their backs to the wall in the second half (下半 场).
- ◆ He was in debt (陷入债务) and could not get any help; his back was against the wall.

be anything but 绝不

Susan is anything but poor.

beat about the bush or: beat around the bush

说话不明确,旁敲侧击;回避问题或要点

- ◆ The boss (老板) would not answer yes or no, but beat about the bush.
- ◆ She beat about the bush for a half hour without coming to the point (要点).

beat into one's head 反复地教; 重复; 练习

◆ Alex is lazy and slow (头脑反应慢) and his lessons have to be beaten into his head.

◆ I cannot beat it into his head that he should take off (摘掉) his hat (帽子) in the house.

beat it 快走开;快速地出来

- ◆ When she heard the crash (撞击声) she beat it (快速出来) as fast as she could.
- ◆ The big boy said, "Beat it (快走开), kid. We don't want you with us."

beat one's brains out or: beat one's brains

绞尽脑汁;勤奋思索

◆ It was too hard (困难的) for him and he beat his brains out trying to get the answer (答案).

beat the bushes also: beat the brush 努力寻求或获得某物

◆The governor (州长) was beating the bushes for funds (资金) to build the playground (操场,运动场).

be broke 破产的;身无分文的

◆ Peter was broke after his vacation (假期).

bed of roses or: bowl of cherries

轻松愉快的地方、工作、职位;舒适的生活

- ◆A coal miner's (煤矿工人的) job is not a bed of roses.
- ◆ After nine months of school, summer camp (夏令营) seemed a bowl of cherries.

behind one's back 在背后;背着人或未经人同意;秘密地
