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前 言

如何在英语教学中体现培养学生的多方位、严密的逻辑思维能力及语言交际能力,是英语教学中贯彻实施素质教育的一个要内容,也是广大英语教学工作者长期着力研究的一大课题。目前,英语练习题名目繁多,浩如瀚海,且常有重复,往往给学生增加了课业负担,学生重复劳动过多,造成了事倍功半的结果。作为一个在教学第一线工作了近20年的中学英语高级教师,我在进行合理适度的双基训练的同时,为学生精编了习题,以提高学生的操练效果,努力培养学生思维的严密性、逻辑性,强调培养学生扎实的语言、语法、句型及语言交际能力,现将多年的探索汇编成册。

本书分为第一、第二两部分。根据多年来编者在教学中对学生的常见错误的分析,紧扣《全日制高中英语学科课程标准》大纲,编出了以高中一至六册教材为范围的精编选择题。力求做到高考模拟性强,选择题各选项干扰性强,基本覆盖了对所有高中英语语言、语法、句法、词义辨析的难点和高中六册中逢双课交际语的惯用语句型的考查。并针对高中学生语法难点——动词及其非谓语形式,编出了综合时态、语态、虚拟语气和主谓一致的专项练习。经过操练能使学生达到举一反三、融汇贯通的效果,并有助于学生打好扎实的英语写作基础。本书不增加学生无谓的负担,同时又能使学生通过操练、思维,较快地形成学习英语的悟性。本书中所有材料在编者多年的高中英语教学中已经收到良好效果。

书中如有不妥之处,请读者不吝指正。
