

### 前 言

《大学英语四级考试——词汇与结构习题集萃 2200 详解》主要包括以下内容: (一) 关于大学英语四级考试, 重点介绍国家教委主持制订的《大学英语教学大纲》对大学英语四级教学的要求和四级统考试题的内容结构; (二) 词汇与语法结构练习试题; (三) 练习答案详解。

词汇练习题是依照国家教委颁发的《大学英语教学大纲通用词汇表(1—4级)》所列词汇,从国内外各类试题中精选出的最常用、搭配力最强、考试频度最大的四级词汇和短语试题 1700 题。语法结构部分 500 题,包括了所有考试频度大的重要语法项目及固定结构,如语态、时态、情态动词、不定式(含不定式完成式)、分词和分词独立结构、要求以动名词作宾语的动词及其结构、关系从旬、一致关系、强调旬、让步从旬、比较关系从旬、复合宾语、倒装旬、省略旬、量词与倍数、附加疑问句、连词、名词及所有格等,同时也注意了将每种语法现象不同的试题尽可能齐全地编入,因此,本书试题的命中率非常高。

为帮助读者精确掌握本书所收词汇与语法项目的内容,每个练习后面均附有各习题答案的详细讲解。为弥补收词有限之足,注释特别注意了对每个词条多种搭配的讲解,对同义词和和之义词作了对比列举,尤其对容易搞错的同义、近义词作了详细讲解。同时为了帮助读者扩充词汇量,本书尽可能将多义词的各重要"四级"词义列入。当各类重要语法项目在练习中第一次遇到时,注释一般先对该语法项目作总的概括性说明,以使读者对其先有个全面了解,以后遇到同类语法题时则作简明讲解,以起到

巩固和加深印象之作用。

需要说明的是,《大学英语教学大纲通用词汇表(1—4级)》 所列 4000 单词是最基本的常用词汇,既是四级考试取得成功的 基础,也是六级考试和研究生考试取得成功的基础。对正规六级 试题和考研试题的分析表明,六级试题的词汇与结构的 30 小题 中,语法结构约占 10 题,词汇题 20 个,其中六级词汇约 6—9 个,其余 11—14 个仍是四级词汇。考研试题中的词汇与语法题 40 个,其中 20 个语法题,20 个词汇题,如 1995 年考研试题中 有 17 个四级词汇题。六级试题和考研试题的语法项目与四级试 题内容大体相同。因此,本书是大学英语四、六级考生和研究生 考生的必读之书。

本书的阅读对象为大学英语四、六级考生、研究生考生、托福考生、EPT考生和英语自学者,也是大学、中学英语教师的有益参考书。

相信本书将有助于广大读者熟练掌握英语基础知识和有效地提高英语应试能力。

### 1. 关于大学英语四级考试

由国家教委主持制订的于 1986 年正式公布的《大学英语教学大纲(文理科本科用)》规定了对高等学校非英语专业的本科生进行英语教学的基本要求和教学目的。《大纲》规定:"大学英语教学的目的,是培养学生具有较强的阅读能力、一定的听的能力、初步的写和说的能力……。"《大纲》还规定,非英语专业大学英语教学分为基础阶段和专业阅读阶段,对基础阶段的教学又提出了基本要求和较高要求,达到四级为基本要求,达到六级为较高要求。

《大纲》对基础阶段达到四级的基本要求是: (一) 词汇: "领会式掌握 4000 单词(其中复用式掌握的单词 2300 个)以及 一定量的常用词组,并具有按照构词法识别生词的能力。"所谓 "领会式掌握"是指对《大纲》规定应掌握的词汇在一定的上下 文中能知道其词义、识别其词类等。所谓"复用式掌握"是指不 但能识其类、知其义,还会运用。1993年12月正式公布的《大 学英语教学大纲通用词汇表 (1-4级)》, 详细列出了大学英语 四级所应掌握的 4000 单词 (包括中学已掌握的 1600 单词)。 (二) 语法:"进一步巩固和加深基本语法知识、具有在语篇水平 上运用语法知识的能力。"在《大纲》附表中详细列举了对语法 结构方面的基本要求,其中最主要的有:虚拟语气、情态动词、 非谓语动词、一致关系、关系从句、倒装句、强调句、省略、替 代等。(三)阅读能力:"掌握基本阅读技能、能顺利阅读并正确 理解一般题材、语言难度中等的文章,速度达到每分钟50 词……阅读理解的准确率不低于70%。"(四)听的能力:"能听 懂英语讲课。对题材熟悉、浅于课文、基本上无生词、语速为每 分钟 120 词的听力材料,一遍可以听懂,理解的准确率不低于70%。"(五)写的能力:"能按照规定的题目和提示,在半小时内写出 100—120 词的短文,内容连贯,无重大语法错误。"《大纲》规定在完成四级教学时"应按本大纲的要求进行全国统一考试。"截止 1995 年元月,全国已进行了 14 次大学英语四级考试。

《大学英语四级考试》试题共分五个部分:第一部分听力, 20 分钟,20 小题,占20 分;第二部分阅读理解,35 分钟,有4 篇短文,20 小题,占40 分;第三部分词汇与结构,20 分钟,30 小题,占15 分;第四部分完形填空,15 分钟,20 小题,占10 分;第五部分写作,30 分钟,占15 分。

对四级试题的分析表明,四级试题的词汇与结构 30 小题中,词汇约 15 题,其中有动词和动词短语 5—7 题,名词(包括后面要求跟固定介词搭配的名词)2—3 题,形容词(包括后面要求跟固定介词搭配的形容词)及副词 3—4 题,介词短语 2—3 题。语法结构部分 15 题左右,主要包括虚拟语气(每次至少 1—2 题,多时 3—4 题)、时态(2—3 题)、非谓语动词(包括分词作状语和定语、分词独立结构、不定式一般式及完成式等共约 3—4 题)、情态动词(1—2 题)、关系从句及名词性从句(2—3 题)、复合宾语(1—2 题),其它还有一致关系、强调句、让步状语从句、倒装句、省略句、比较关系从句、量词与倍数、连词、附加疑问句等。

也许有人认为词汇与结构在四级试题中所占分数比例不大, 因而可不予重视。这种看法是有害的。虽然词汇与结构试题在四 级试题中只占 15 分,但它是其它各项取得成功的基础。实践表 明,凡词汇量大、语法知识坚实的考生一般均能考出优异成绩。 相反,一个词汇量小、语法知识浅薄的考生,不可能对其它各项 考出优异的成绩。因此,打好词汇与语法结构的基本功是争取四 级考试取得优异成绩的必由之路。
