

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#### 内 容 提 要

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#### 使 用 说 明

学语言的人都知道,要想掌握一门语言的各种技能,如无坚实的词汇基础,一切都将是空的。语言学习的基础的基础就在词汇的掌握使用上。对参加国家水平测试的广大考生来说,词汇量的多少同样是十分重要的。其重要性不仅在于它能保证考生在词汇结构题项上拿高分,也在于能使考生顺利完成其他各题项。因而,从某种意义上来说,能否通过四级水平测试,取决于考生是否掌握了必要的词汇量。《大学英语通用词汇》的出版,为使用不同教材体系的学生在词汇上起到了指导性的作用。但并不能说将词汇表中的词汇背出就足以应付考试了。词汇的掌握除了词汇意义的掌握外,更主要的,且对不少学生来说也是更难的,是掌握词汇的具体用法。为此,我们编写了《大学英语大纲通用词汇练习与题解》一书。目的是通过范句,使使用者对词汇更容易掌握,避免"见木不见林"这一现象。同时通过大量例句及有针对性的解释,使使用者能较准确地掌握使用重点难词。

本书共编有 30 套练习试题,每套 50 句。主干词及配套词均选自《大学英语通用词汇》。基本包容了要求掌握的四级所有词汇。按词形、词义及不同的生成搭配三方面进行选词配套。并在题解中部分重点地对词义及生成搭配两方面作了实用性、针对性较强的解释,让读者不仅知其然,也能知其所以然。题解中,对每题中出现的配套词,也按其不同用法及搭配配上例句,从而使读者能对相关词有较全面的了解和掌握。

本书共分三部分,第一部分为"练习试题",第二部分为"题解",第三部分为"答案",使之能作为课堂词汇教学及测试使用,本书也是一本较好的词汇自学材料。相信通过使用本书,读者能在较

短时间内达到正确掌握大学英语大纲通用词汇这一目标。
