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内容提要

本套丛书按照上海市高考听力的标准形式,将 90 套听力材料按难易分别编入高一至高三 3 册。所选材料全部来自上海市历年高考真题及最近 4 年各区一模、二模试题,是上海地区高中学生提高英语应试能力的首选读物,也可用于辅助教师教学。

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前 言

上海市高考英语的听力部分连续多年题型保持不变,采用的考查方式依次为:短对话(多项选择)、短文(多项选择)和长对话(填空)。本套丛书即根据这一命题形式编写而成,其主要特点体现在以下两个方面。

(一) 题型、题量、文章体裁及难度完全依照上海市高考要求编写。目前上海市场上销售的听力图书大多兼顾全国市场,因此不适合上海地区学生使用。如外地卷听力的多项选择为三选一,而上海卷为四选一;外地卷的问题在试卷上,而上海卷的问题在听力材料中;外地卷短文的难度相当于阅读的初二或初三,而上海卷短文的难度相当于高一或高二。可以说,听力是上海卷和外地卷难度相差最大的题型之一(另一种是完形填空)。造成的结果就是:如果选用图书不当,听力效果无疑会大打折扣,而本套丛书则彻底解决了这些问题。

(二) 材料来源针对性强。本书内容全部选自上海市历年高考真题及最近4年各区一模、二模试题。我们剔除了其中重复和雷同的部分,并尽量选用在阅读中没有出现过的短文,以避免出现降低训练效果的情况。由于高考真题的权威性毋庸置疑,一模、二模为各区统考,严格按照上海市考纲拟题,历来为教师、学生及家长所重视,因而演练这些试题无疑具有更好的效果(需要说明的是,各区一模、二模的听力试题60%是大学四级真题的下放)。我们采用难度分阶的形式,将所有文章由浅入深分别编入高一年级至高三年级3册,学生只需循序渐进,高考时自可得心应手。

由于时间仓促,错谬之处敬请广大读者不吝赐教。
