本书为《中级英语测试指导》系列书之一,全书汇集了 2003 版至 2005 版 3 册书中最精典的高考模拟试题单项练习,主要包含听力、语法、词汇、综合填空、语篇理解、翻译、写作等高考英语试卷涉及的所有项目。旨在帮助高考学生和广大高中生更好地掌握英语语言知识,提高英语综合运用能力,并且在全面复习的基础上进行自测,争取获得最佳成绩。

《中级英语测试指导》自1995年问世以来,每年修订出版一次,受到广大高中教师和学生的好评,获得了较好的社会效益。
