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



## **Earnest Hemingway**

### Notes

- 1. Ernest Miller Hemingway (1899—1961): One of the most famous and influential American writers of the 20th century. Many of his stories and novels were based on his personal experiences. Hemingway's style of writing is striking. He often uses short sentences and simple words to convey deep feelings and emotion. Hemingway's most well-known novels include The Sun Also Rises (1926), A Farewell to Arms (1929), For Whom the Bell Tolls (1940) and The Old Man and the Sea (1952). He was awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1954.
- Nobel Prize: An annual prize established by Alfred Nobel, Swedish inventor of dynamite, given to those who have done outstanding work in physics, chemistry, medicine or physiology, literature, economics and the promotion of peace.
