

前言

《初中英语阅读》是《英语》(新标准)"一条龙"初中阶段教材的配套出版物,供老师开展课上阅读或指导学生开展课外自主阅读使用。

本教材是依据国家《英语课程标准》关于初中学生英语阅读能力培养要求编写的,总的指导思想是使学生通过一定的阅读实践活动,进一步巩固课上所学语言知识,扩大阅读范围,激发他们的学习兴趣,增强阅读理解能力,从而提高学生实际运用语言的能力。

本教材采用主题模块化设计,每个模块有3个单元,每个单元有1篇文章。文章长度150 350词不等,基本沿用教材主题。在上述总的编写思想指导下,本教材具有以下特色:

- 一、体现国家《英语课程标准》理念,充分吸收先进的阅读和语言学习理论,借鉴"任务型学习(task-based learning)"原则,科学合理地设计教材结构,安排学习内容,注重体现学用结合。
- 二、以激发学生学习兴趣为出发点。对青少年学生来讲,趣味性强的学习材料和活动能够进一步激发他们的学习兴趣和学习动机,从而提高学习效果。本教材选材及活动设计充分考虑了初中学生的知识水平和认知水平,以及他们的兴趣、爱好和愿望等心理需求。
- 三、强调培养学生阅读能力,但同时注重多种语言技能协同发展。在语言学习阶段,传统观念把阅读视为语言输入的一种方式,将其与听、说、写割裂开来学习与训练。而在实际交际中,语言运用是一个整体概念,是多种技能的有机结合。本教材改变以往做法,围绕阅读设计了多种活动和任务,采取读前观察与思考、读中体验与思考、读后思考并写、说的模式,充分调动学生的观察力和想象力,使其通过多种感知和体验,在输入的基础上逐渐锻炼输出能力,从而提高综合语言运用能力。

四、阅读材料的编写基于语言学习规律,其词汇和语言结构的呈现符合初中学生的认知能力和身心发展水平,与新课程标准要求一致,并力求保持与教材同步,兼顾拓展性。

五、注重阅读技能的训练和阅读理解能力的培养。活动和练习形式灵活多样,既 有客观性的阅读理解训练,又有开放性的练习形式,从多角度对学生语言技能进行训 练、为学生形成一定的英语阅读能力奠定良好基础。

我们希望,这套阅读教材作为主教材的有益补充,不仅能够解决初中学生阅读资源不足的问题,而且能够进一步拓展学生视野,帮助学生养成良好的阅读习惯,掌握学习策略,在文化意识方面得到加强,综合素质得到提高。







An interview with Professor Xiong

"We cannot live without trees", said Professor Xiong on her visit to our school last month to talk about how we could protect our environment for the future.

We interviewed Professor Xiong in the school office. We asked her why trees were so important. She told us that trees clean the air for us and provide oxygen for us to breathe. Trees provide us with many different types of fruit, and trees are very beautiful. She suggested that when we felt tired we should go and look at trees. We would find it very relaxing.

"In the last three thousand years we have cut down more than half the world's forests, and now we are losing forests faster than before." Professor Xiong insisted that this must stop. "We must save the forests now."

When we asked her how forests made the world a better place, Professor Xiong explained that forests contain many different plants and animals. They hold a lot of water. "When people cut down the trees, we are in danger of floods." Trees also make the soil rich.

We asked the professor how many trees were cut down every year, and she said it was about four billion. Trees were cut down for firewood, wood for building, furniture and paper, and to clear land for new buildings and roads.

"Here in China we are planting a lot of trees. We must save the old forests and only use wood from the new ones for paper and useful things. We can also recycle more wood when things become old. We must not waste any. We must think of the environment as well as our daily needs. If we take too much, one day we will be very sorry about it."

We thanked Professor Xiong for sharing her knowledge with us. We asked when she would visit us again and she said she would come if we invited her, and she hoped to see even more trees around the school.
