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《 'Ride the Wave' 初中英语学习策略指导》 是根据国家教育部制订的《全日制义务教育 普通高级中学 英语课程标准 (实验稿)》而编写的, 全套书以发展学生英语语言交际技能 (Communicative Competence),发展英语学习策略(Learning Strategies)、形成文化意识(Cultural Awareness),提高学习自主性(Learner Autonomy)为总体目的。

全套书共有6分册,按从易到难顺序排列,听力部分配有录音带。各册书均强调学生的自主参与和合作,注重学习的过程性,通过感知,体验、实践、运用和探究等活动方式,帮助学生在完成各种学习任务的过程中发展听、说、读、写、单词记忆、自我评价、安排学习等方面的学习策略,最终获得语言综合运用能力的发展。全套书对学习策略的介绍按两条线索来编排,分别是第一部分的专门的学习策略介绍及贯穿在第二、三、四部分的与任务内容相关的学习策略介绍。根据初中学生的实际情况,策略的介绍均提供了中文提示。各册书均设八个单元,每单元分为四部分、分别是:

Section I Managing Learning (介绍英语学习策略)

Section II Accessing Meaning (以听,读为主的学习任务)

Section III Producing Meaning (以说, 写为主的学习任务)

Section IV Assessing Progress (学习评价)

## Dealing with teacher feedback on your spoken English

If you look in a good monolingual dictionary you will find different meanings of "rip". For example it can mean:

"To tear or pull something quickly away from something or someone" Or it can mean:

"To make a long tear or a cut in something"

These two different uses of "to rip" are good to remember. A good way to remember them is to make different sentences using the new words you have come across. For example:

"As he was walking through the rose-garden he ripped his shirt on some thorns"

"She was so angry with the test paper that she ripped it into two."

"The dog ripped the meat from the bone."

"Rip" also has idiomatic meaning:

"to rip off" means to cheat on someone. So you could say: "I bought this bag in the market but I think I was ripped off because the handle broke after only one day." "to rip into" means to attack something or someone violently. But be careful it has very limited use in this sense. You could say: "the teacher ripped into me because I hadn't done my homework." This would mean "he really shouted at me in a violent way".



David Chang's job is not an easy one. To do it well you have to have a good ear. David

David Chang's job is not an easy one. To do it well you have to have a good ear. David Chang, one of a small number of piano tuners (调音师)in Beijing, is kept busy every week. He adores music and plays the piano very well. He once told a reporter "My father wanted me to be a pianist and one day play on the international stage. But I developed a real interest in piano tuning and getting it just right. Some of the tuners can hardly play. It's good to be able to play, because you can show how the piano sounds once it's perfectly tuned."

People say he was born with a good ear perhaps because he was born into a family full of musicians. When he was seven he started playing the piano seriously. David once said "Piano tuning is in my blood. Once you're into it, piano tuning becomes a passion and a hobby rather than a job. I couldn't do anything else."
