阅读是学习语言基本技能的重要组成部分,是获取信息的重要手段之一,大量的阅读还能促进其他语言技能的提高。因此,培养阅读能力在英语学习过程中占有十分重要的地位。为了配合《英语(新目标)》教材的使用,根据新英语课程标准的要求,我们特地编写了《英语(新目标)同步阅读训练》丛书。全书共分6册,供7~9年级使用。它的基本特点如下:

- 1. 单元设置、题材和难易程度与《英语(新目标)》教材同步,便于学生巩固课本知识、并适当拓展知识面。
 - 2. 材料真实新颖、插图生动活泼、语言运用的灵活性。

- 3. 寓阅读策略于阅读活动之中,注重阅读技能与说、写等其他技能训练的结合。 本书每一单元分为以下5个部分:
- "热身活动"(Appetizers): 提供了一些图片, 目的是为学生打开几扇通往生活的窗口, 引导他们从不同的角度来观察本单元的主题、关注生活中相关的人和事, 并培养他们使用词 典的习惯。
- "语言知识"(Soups): 呈现每一单元的主要生词、短语、语法点和句型,需要学生在归纳、小结的同时,为进入"阅读训练"做好准备。本部分还注意了阅读与朗读训练的结合。
- "阅读训练"(Main Courses): 每个单元的主体部分, 叉分为 "Read and Act", "Read and Think" 和 "Read and Write" 3个小部分。
- "Read and Act"部分注意了阅读和说话训练的结合,目的是提高学生阅读的积极性和主动性。
 - "Read and Think"部分融入了阅读策略,为的是帮助学生学会有效阅读。
- "Read and Write"部分注意了读写训练的结合,但这种写是有引导、有控制的, 学生可以在这种适量的写的活动中自然消化阅读内容。
- "学学做做"(Desserts): 给学生一个"自己动手"的机会,让他们用所学语言去做一件事,并在这一过程中巩固和发展语言能力。本部分可以作为课内或者课外的一个活动来完成。
- "欣赏提高"(Drinks): 旨在引导学生阅读和欣赏一些英语成语、小诗和英语 影片台词等,培养他们的文化意识。

由于编者水平有限,加之成书时间仓促,书中必定有谬误与疏漏之处,敬请读者批评指正、以便再版时修正、补充。







- 8. Let your mind (思想) **wander free**, but be careful with what you say. There are a lot of police (警察) on the web.
