

前言



《新世纪英语教程(专科)》是一套为高等学校夜大、函大等成人高等教育而编写的英语教材,同时也可以作为高等专科院校和高职、高专院校英语教材使用,旨在为新世纪的大学英语教学服务。

本套教材的使用者应该已经有大约 900 词的英语词汇量(参见第一册书后所附的基本词汇表),具有初步的英语语法知识和读、听、说英语的能力。本套教材的培养目标是:培养学生掌握较扎实的英语基础知识、具有较强的英语阅读能力,能听懂一般的英语会话材料,可以进行简单的日常英语会话,具有一定的翻译和写作能力。

本教材由课本(即《新世纪英语教程(专科)》)共四册和与各册配套的《新世纪英语教程(专科)自学指导》共四册组成,供四个学期使用。每册含12课,进度基本上可以按每周一课安排。本教材每课均涉及同一个主题,两篇文章各有侧重。围绕这些与学生生活和工作息息相关的热门话题,学生可以在教师的指导下充分发挥其学习的主动性,进行一定的语言活动,提高语言应用能力。由于话题相同,词汇复现率大大提高,有助于学生提高单词记忆效果。本教材每课前的听力材料主要目的是使学生通过听掌握英语常用会话句型,从而可以达到进行简单日常口头交际的能力。考虑到夜大、函大的学生上课时间不多,他们主要是通过自学学习英语,本套教材的自学指导书对每课课文都进行了相当详细的注释。这些注释涉及语法、词汇等语言难点,对常用句型结构和词汇均通过给出例句说明其用法,并对常用的同义词和近义词进行了辨析。这些详细的注释有利于使用本教材的读者加深对课文的理解。由于自学指导书中有较详细的课文注释并附有练习答案,因此教师不必再花太多的宝贵课堂教学时间讲解课文,而可以将更多的课堂时间用在提高学生的语言应用能力上,从而使学生真正成为课堂教学的主角。

一词多义是英语词汇的一大特点,因此尽管有些词已出现在基本词汇表中,但 考虑到它们的词义变化和用法,我们仍在课文后的词汇表中列出,并在课文注释中 进行讲解,在课文练习中进行操练,以提高学生运用这些常用词的能力。

本套教材的练习相对来说是不多的,这与我们的教学理念不无关系。我们从多年的教学实践中深刻体会到,练习只是英语教学中的一个环节。大量的练习在一定

情况下(如为了参加某种考试)是有效的,但要想真正提高语言应用能力,还是要把时间和精力花在语言本身,即大量的接触所学语言上。我们希望读者把更多的时间用在听英语(课文、广播、电视节目、VCD等)上,用在广泛地阅读原文上,并在可能的情况下,多说英语,多进行英语写作和翻译训练,从而提高英语的综合应用能力。在学习本套教材时,读者应把更多的时间放在课文学习中,通过反复朗读,直至可以背诵课文来学习英语,以培养起良好的语感。持之以恒,必见成效。

为了保持英语语法体系的完整性,我们将语法单独编写成册,而不再分项编在每课中。但教师可根据学生的实际语法水平,每学期就 3-5 个语法专题进行专题讲座式的讲解,以加深学生对英语语法的掌握。

本套教材的编者都是长期工作在大学英语教学和成人英语教学第一线的教师,对中国学生学习英语的特点有多年的研究。在本书的编写中,我们将我们的想法和体会贯穿其中,使本套教材具有了上述特色。我们真诚地希望这些编写特色有助于提高读者的自学效率。

You hear a lot these days about the coming death of the personal computer. But the reality is more complicated and more interesting.2 Researchers, analysts and other experts predict that an explosion of networked, single-purpose intelligent, devices will replace the all-purpose, onesize-fits-all PC.³ The PC is too complicated. It is too big. Users are tired. At the same time, prices are falling so quickly that it will soon be impossible to make money on them.4 Many predict that in the near future people can get the machine free but pay for the Internet

Windows 2000 will run on PCs, workstations and servers all the way up to massive data warehouses. Windows CE will run on everything else, from watches to cell phones to dedicated game machines.

- 8 The PC will still be one of the most important platforms, of course, since business users are not about to replace their PCs with single-purpose devices. ¹⁵ You will still need a powerful processor for speech recognition and number-crunching, fast graphics for that large, flat-screen monitor, and a standard development platform for a wide variety of applications. ¹⁶
